This is the first of two sections for the HOACGA Notebook on candlesticks. This section covers seventy-two patterns. With this notebook section an attempt has been made to identify as many Carnival (iridized) candlesticks as possible. It is hoped this will provide some common reference for the carnival glass collector and others who have an occasion to research this subject. The colors listed for each of the candlesticks may not be completely correct. The listing is the result of information supplied by members and by searching the reference material listed at the end of this section. In some cases only one candlestick is shown, that is only because a photograph of a pair was not available.

This is one area of Carnival glass collecting about which, very little information has been written. The early as well as the current Carnival glass reference books have given very little print to candlesticks. Many of these do not have a pattern name, and are identified by the manufacturer's pattern num-

ber. Most have a smooth, non-patterned surface, so are generally classified as Stretch glass. For this section, if they are iridized and a photograph is available they have been included. Some items within this section may be depression era glass. They are included here to add to our knowledge of candlesticks. You can draw your own conclusion as to whether they are Carnival glass, Stretch glass, or depression era glass.

Most of the reference books about the various glass makers only identify a few of these, so it was necessary to consult with many collectors and refer to several reference books in order to identify as many of these as possible. In several cases two or more glass companies made very similar candlesticks and the difference is the dimensions, colors made, or the size of the candle cup. Refer to the "Makers Identification" information, at the end of this section. It helps identify the makers of the Colonial (Florentine), short Trumpet, tall Trumpet, and Spindle candlesticks.








