
VASES FIFTH SECTION — 2000



311. FIRCONE

This fifth section on vases is the year 2000 addition to the HOACGA Pattern Notebook. It contains those vases whose pattern name starts with the letters Trumpet thru Z, and the known non-US vases which were not previously reported. This concludes the alphabetical listing and identification of those vases where a photograph was available.

Since starting the vase section, additional vases have been reported. They will be included in the next vase section. The intent is to identify as many of the patterns as is prudent.
