

# EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES By John & Lucile Britt



RISING SUN WATER AND JUICE SIZE TUMBLERS

Through the years we have written many articles on carnival glass tumblers. All of them have been a big pleasure to us. Some of the articles, such as those that were written about unheard of tumblers in such patterns as Fostoria's Sidney, the Cambridge Sweetheart tumblers, Northwood's marigold Peach tumbler (two known) and the extremely rare purple Northwood's Near-Cut (Stretched Diamonds & Hobstars) tumbler (only one reported) have given us even a greater thrill. There are many other examples in this category, but we won't attempt to mention them all, due to the lack of space. We will, however, mention the great pleasure in writing about the famous Big Butterfly and Frolicking Bears tumblers. But to find and write about this unknown and unheard of juice size Rising Sun partial set in deep marigold, probably tops them all for us. Understand this does not apply to value, but to find this rare size juice set, one that we have never heard of in carnival glass, or even crystal for that matter, was a thrill we will always remember.

Photo #1 shows the large or water size tumbler in cobalt blue. Only 5 or 6 of these have ever been reported in cobalt blue. The small juice size tumbler is on the right. The juice size tumbler is  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " tall with a top opening of 2 1/8". The base is 1 3/8" in diameter. The large or standard size water tumbler is  $4\frac{1}{4}$ " high. The top opening is 2 3/4" and the base is  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " wide. Both tumblers have the sunburst type figure pressed into the underside of the base.

Photo #2 shows the standard size water pitcher and tumbler on the left. This water pitcher is much wider and somewhat taller than the juice size pitcher and holds considerable more liquid. The juice size examples are shown on the right. Notice the difference in the base on the two pitchers. We have also seen the water pitcher in the skirted type that did not have the pedestal base. A larger water pitcher in the same shape as the juice pitcher also exists. For as few of these water pitchers that were ever made, one wonders why they made them in three different shapes. Rising Sun is a U. S. Glass Company pattern.

This unusual and rare juice size tumbler, that we feature here, is article number 140 in this series. Next month we will feature the beautiful Curtain Optic tumbler, which was made by Fenton.

We are going to take another look at some of the old ads from more of the 1972 Antique Traders. We are quite surprised, as we are sure you all are, at the prices asked for and the great pieces offered back in the early 1970's. Here are some of then, that we thought might be of interest to you.

CAUDLE ANTIQUES, STATE ROAD, NORTH CAROLINA: Pastel green Peacocks on the Fence bowl \$119.00; marigold Kittens 7 fluted bowl, dark color \$49.00; marigold Mikado large open compote \$79.00; (Note: The Caudles are still in business today. He recently told us that they couldn't find many good pieces anymore. We purchased our rare blue Fishermans mug from them through the Antique Trader back in the 1970's.)

VICKI L. LAMB, DE GRAFF, OHIO: White Grape & Cable pin tray, excellent iridescence \$235.00; Northwoods Poppy custard relish dish \$23.00.

GEORGE CRAMER, TOLEDO, OHIO: Ice blue opal Peacocks on the Fence bowl \$185.00; green Beaded Cable rose bowl \$45.00.

KATHRYN GARGER, ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI: Amethyst Peacocks on the Fence plate \$130.00; amethyst opal Holly hat shape \$25.00; purple Hobstar creamer & covered sugar \$65.00; aqua opal Leaf & Beads rose bowl \$70.00; amethyst Peacock & Urn, Millersburg ice cream bowl \$110.00.

DAN STUCKER, COLUMBUS, MISSISSIPPI: White Peacocks on the Fence P.C.E. bowl, frosty & rainbow iridescence \$120.00; ice green Rose Show bowl, excellent iridescence \$195.00; Grape & Cable hat pin holder \$105.00; green Millersburg Nesting Swan 10" bowl \$100.00; (Note: Do you remember Dan and his wife? In the early days they were at most of the Conventions and Woody auctions. He found lots of good glass. Cooley Miller purchased it and later sold it to Ken Osbon. Karen Engle is now the proud owner of that rare and beautiful bowl.)





# PICTORIAL PATTERN PARADE By John & Lucile Britt



STAR & FILE WINE AND THE VERY RARE CORDIAL

We feature here the extremely rare Star & File cordial which is shown on the right. This little cordial is the only one that we have ever seen. This pattern was made by the Imperial Glass Corporation of BellaIRE, Ohio. We have read old Imperial catalog material and knew that this cordial was made and sold in marigold carnival glass, but we never could find one for our collection. The Star & File wines can be found rather often and they were a part of a decanter set. The cordial is a different story, however. We searched in vain for years to find one of these, and it was not until the A.C.G.A. Convention in 1988, at Camp Hill, Pennsylvania, that we finally found one. Isaah Sommershein had one there which we quickly purchased from him. We might add that the Star & File goblet was also advertised by Imperial in their old catalogs, but we still have never seen one in the goblet size. You might look for this one, as we are quite sure that there are a few goblets out there somewhere with iridescence.

This tiny cordial is  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " tall with a top opening of  $1\frac{1}{2}$ ". The base is slightly over  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " in diameter. On the other hand, the wine is 4" tall and is 2" across the top. The base is slightly over 2" wide. Both pieces have the same sunburst type figure pressed into the underside of their bases. Marigold is the only color that has been reported in this pattern in carnival glass.
