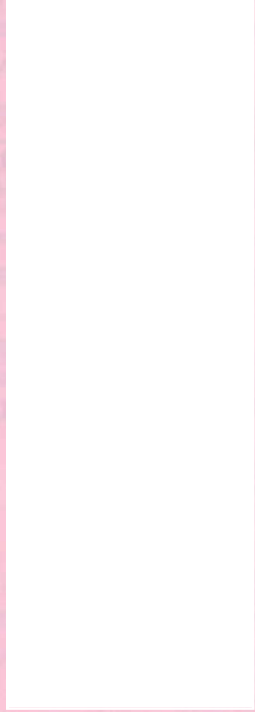

## EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES

### BUTTONS AND FANS TUMBLER

We are featuring here a very pretty and interesting carnival glass pattern. The tumbler is in good marigold color with very nice iridescence. It is 3 3/4" tall and 2 3/4" across the top. The underside of the base contains a 16 point rayed start. A 3/4" plain band circles the tumbler at the top. Below this band is a group of designs making it a very busy pattern. The two main motifs are the 6 buttons that are evenly spaced around the tumbler at the center and the fans that are alternated with the buttons. Hence the name Buttons and Fans.

The featured Buttons and Fans tumbler is owned by Cecil and Floyd Whitley. They purchased the tumbler from Jerry Wood, DeQuincy, Louisiana, a nationally known glass dealer that sets up at antique shows around the country. I understand that he bought the tumbler from Larry

Yung of Cincinnati, Ohio, a carnival glass collector. This was in 1989 and the cost of this very nice tumbler was \$400.00. It is indeed a rare tumbler.

I mentioned at the start of this article that this was a very interesting pattern. It is especially interesting to Cecil and I because we both knew that this pattern existed since 1978. Below, we show a sketch of the water pitcher that matches the featured tumbler. Back in 1978, Joe Olson, in his popular "News and Views in Carnival Glass" bulletin showed this same sketch and asked if anyone knew the name of this mystery water pitcher. He could find no one who knew the name of the pattern or the company that made it. Since this pattern has been known to exist at least since 1978 without a name, Cecil and I decided to call it Buttons and Fans.

## PUNCH OR FRUIT

On January 9, 1982, John Woody held an auction in St. Louis that featured the collections of Mr. & Mrs. Joe Olson of Kansas City, Missouri and Mr. & Mrs. Joe Harrington Jr. of Cummings, Georgia and highlighted by some of the rarities that Jim and Marlene Mogg could not be persuaded to part with at the time their collection was sold.

The sketch illustrated in our article was shown in the 1982 auction just as it appears here. Notice that under the pitcher are the words "Mystery Water Pitcher", "leading experts remain unable to name this pattern and its maker," Offered in marigold in this auction. This water pitcher that is now known as Buttons and Fans sold for \$225.00

Grape & Cable Sweetmeat \$700.00, P. Grape & Cable candle lamp \$200.00, M. Inverted Strawberry pitcher and 4 tumblers \$1,400.00, G. Heavy Vine compote \$1,300.00, P. Tornado vase \$120.00, P. Acorn Burrs water set \$520.00. This is just a sampling from the 396 piece auction.

This article on the very pretty Buttons and Fans tumbler is our 229th entry into our Educational Tumbler Series. Next month we feature several Beaded Spears Variants that were found by Bob Smith on his recent trip to India.

I am no authority, I do not do that much research. I really do not claim to know all that much about carnival glass. We have collected carnival glass for some 25 years for the love of the glass. We have made friends all over the world that we would have never known if it had not been for carnival glass.

There have been several times during our collecting that someone has come up with their idea of the use or name of something that seemed a little far fetched to me. I did not voice my opinion because the older I get the less I know.

I have a question to those who seem to know and claim to be the experts. I would like for them to prove to me the difference. Just within the past two or three years, someone has come up with the idea that the two different MEMPHIS punch sets are not punch sets. The top bowls are from two different molds. The one has a collar base only and sets on the inside of the base. This is the one they say is the true punch bowl. The other bowl is just like the first except it has an eight sided base that sets on the outside of the punch bowl base. This bowl someone say's is a fruit bowl. I have several questions regarding this. How many fruit bowls set on a stand like the punch bowl's? If you put liquid in both Memphis bowls, they will both hold exactly the same amount of liquid, WHY? If this one is a fruit bowl, then why did they dome with punch cups? Did someone just put the punch cups with this not knowing any better? I say NO. I personally known of two of these so called fruit bowl sets coming with the six cups and at that time was called a punch set.

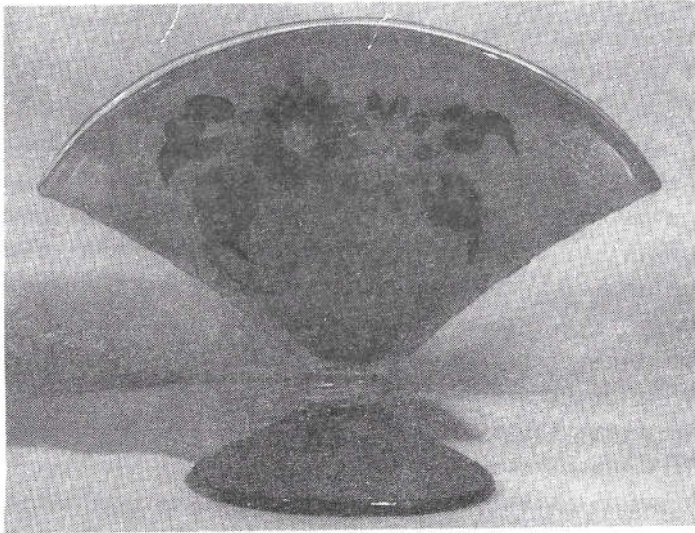
I have the so called white fruit bowl set that has been in our family since the beginning and it has always been a punch set. I guess that is why I would like for someone to prove to me, that it is NOT a punch set.

## PAINTED FAN VASE

The photo doesn't capture the rich marigold and multi colors in the iridescence. By holding this vase so the light reflects off its flat surface, the colors are arrayed rainbow like. The top band is a yellow gold blending to orange. Followed by a band of magenta that leads to a green iridescence and then back to the yellow gold. The top surface of the foot is finely stippled while the body of the vase is more of a pattern of smooth squiggly lines. All of which is most effective in enhancing the iridized effect. Now as if this wasn't enough, a hand painted flower arrangement adorns the front surface.

This hand painted fan vase stands about five and one half inches tall, with a seven inch spread. The foot measures almost three and one half inches in diameter. It was pressed in a two part mould and then compressed into its final fan shaped form by the glass finisher.

The only reference we can find on this vase is in Bill Edward's Carnival Glass 5th edition, on page 186. He states that this vase was first shown by Rose Preznick and she called it a Painted Pansy Fan Vase that can be found in two sizes. This is seemingly the smaller of the two sizes. Like Bill Edwards, we have not seen the larger size ourselves. The name for the vases would be excellent if all the painted floral sprays were pansies. Should you find the vase without the painted flowers, the name Painted Pansies Fan Vase makes even less sense. Edwards struggles with this name and so do we. We have searched high and low through the collection of books in our library but possess not a clue as to who made this vase. Our most recent sighting of this vase was a clear glass non iridized example with still another, not pansies, painted floral spray. It really is an attractive little vase and like many antique mall finds, it gets more pleasing after you get it home.

## AQUA OPAL POPPY SHOW PLATES

In response to the article on Aqua Opal Poppy Show plates and bowls by Alan & Lorraine Pickup.

On March 23, 1980, I purchased an aqua opal Poppy Show plate in my hometown of Cass City, Michigan at an auction held every Sunday evening. It was the first one I had ever seen and at the price of \$197.00, including tax.

This was the beginning of the excitement over the A.O. Poppy Show plate. However, I soon learned there were at least two or three others but all damaged. Mine was mint. A few years later another mint was found. After having mine for about ten years, I sold it to Tom Mordini, who within a year or two sold it to Don Moore, who shortly after died. Mrs. Moore had it the last I knew. She did not put it in the auctions she had of Don's glass. It seems to me that Bruce Hill has the other mint one.

So Alan & Lorraine, this will help bring you up to date somewhat on the plates. I was unaware of a bowl but suspected there should be one, since the place is made from the bowl mold.

You may have wondered why I sold such a prize plate. When the value rose to 10, 15 to 20 thousand dollars I got jittery with the plate on my living room shelf, with thieves, vandals and fire possibilities. Insurance was almost impossible to get and extremely expensive as Tom Mordini found out, we both decided to sell.

In closing, if I could have only one piece of Carnival Glass, I would choose the A.O. Poppy Show plate. To me it is the most beautiful of all Carnival Glass pieces.

### REGAL CAN CARNIVAL GLASS CLOCK

We have always liked unusual pieces and colors in carnival glass. In our opinion this Marigold carnival glass clock would fit into that category very well. It has very nice color and iridescence. The clock stands 5½" high and is 4¼" across the front. The depth is 1 3/4". The metal working parts are contained in a glass compartment in the upper half of the clock. The bottom half of the piece is hollow. The piece is in good working condition.

The pattern was named Regal Cane by the late William Heacock. He showed a marigold iridescent 8¼" tall pitcher in this pattern in The Glass Collector magazine, issue number three, summer 1982, The pitcher was owned by Joe Corrothers. Heacock stated that this possible U.S.G. pitcher was decidedly a member of the Cane family. Through his name contest

series that he featured in his magazine, he later named this pattern Regal Cane. Our featured clock is definitely in the same pattern that is used on this pitcher.

We also have two marigold cordials in the Regal Cane pattern. I found a picture of one of our cordials in the pattern book on Finland glass that was sent to me by Bob Smith while he was in Finland. I might also mention that we purchased this clock from a man from Argentina. While we have a number of ideas of where this piece was made, we can't be sure at the present time and will simply say "Maker Unknown". It is quite possible that this pattern was made by several different glass companies. The photo is courtesy of David Doty.

## MEET RICK AND DEBBIE GRAHAM

It may be difficult for some of us to believe that this young couple from western Kentucky have been collecting Carnival Glass for less than five years. In this relatively short period of time they have made countless friends around the country, joined five Carnival Glass clubs, attended numerous conventions, established a growing collection of glass and acquired considerable knowledge of our hobby.

The HOACGA Board of Directors asked the Grahams if they would be willing to share their Carnival Glass experiences with us... The following letter was recently received from Rick.

Debbie and I live in Owensboro, a quiet town of approximately 54,000 people located alongside the Ohio River in western Kentucky. Debbie is an operator for Bell South and I work in the stockroom of the local hospital. We usually work different shifts, so when we have time off, we like to spend it together. Much of our leisure time is spent searching for Carnival Glass and other collectibles. Besides Carnival Glass, Debbie collects invalid feeders, iron trivets and drying racks. I have a small collection of pocket knives. We have both become interested in opalescent glass, especially unusual and unlisted items.

We are relatively new Carnival Glass collectors, buying our first glass in October of 1992. Juanita Riley, a friend of ours, has collected Carnival Glass for years. We had admired her collection many times, but really didn't know much about Carnival. One evening, while looking at her collection, I noticed a small bowl with a white rim and back. Inquiring about it we learned that it was a Wishbone and Spades sauce in peach opalescent. Later that evening I told Debbie, "If we ever find a piece of Carnival like that and it's not too expensive, I will buy it!" On our next vacation, browsing through a Virginia antique store, we saw a showcase filled with Carnival Glass. A sign on the case read, "Buy any five pieces and get them for half price". In that case was a peach opalescent Coinspot compote. We held an immediate family conference and decided to "take the plunge". Six pieces were selected from the half-price case. We also found a Petal and Fan berry set in another case priced at \$210. After sweating profusely we decided to buy this set also. Upon returning home we rushed to Juanita's house to show her what we had bought and to look at her reference books. We had no idea what the patterns were or what the glass might be worth. Fortunately, the dealer had been very fair pricing the glass. Carnival

fever had overtaken us, and we found that there is no cure!

In our public library, we found an address for HOACGA. It was an old publication, so we wrote to the club secretary in Manhattan, Kansas, for information about the club. A lovely lady, Lucile Britt, promptly responded to our inquiry. Lucile informed us of an upcoming ACGA convention to be held in Lexington, KY, and urged us to attend if there was any way possible. We scrambled to work out vacation time, and arrived at the July 1993 ACGA convention as green as gourds. Our first convention was unbelievable. We almost walked ourselves to death, seeing piece after piece of beautiful Carnival Glass. The collectors we met were very nice. They freely shared with us information about Carnival Glass... and patiently endured many questions by us. Sleep was hard to come by that first convention. The auction at that convention was great. Very nice glass sold at what we were told were very reasonable prices. We didn't buy anything since I think that we were shell shocked by some of the prices.

At Lexington, we also met our new friends, Audrey and Sue Magan. They also live in Owensboro. They have encouraged and helped us as we have progressed as collectors.

We feel like conventions are great. Where else can you see the quantity and quality of glass that is available there? Where else can we enjoy associating with so many fellow collectors? The educational programs on different patterns, shapes, colors, etc. are fantastic.

We are members of the HOACGA, ACGA, ICGA, Air Capital and Lincoln Land clubs. The information available in the club newsletters has really helped us learn more about our new hobby.

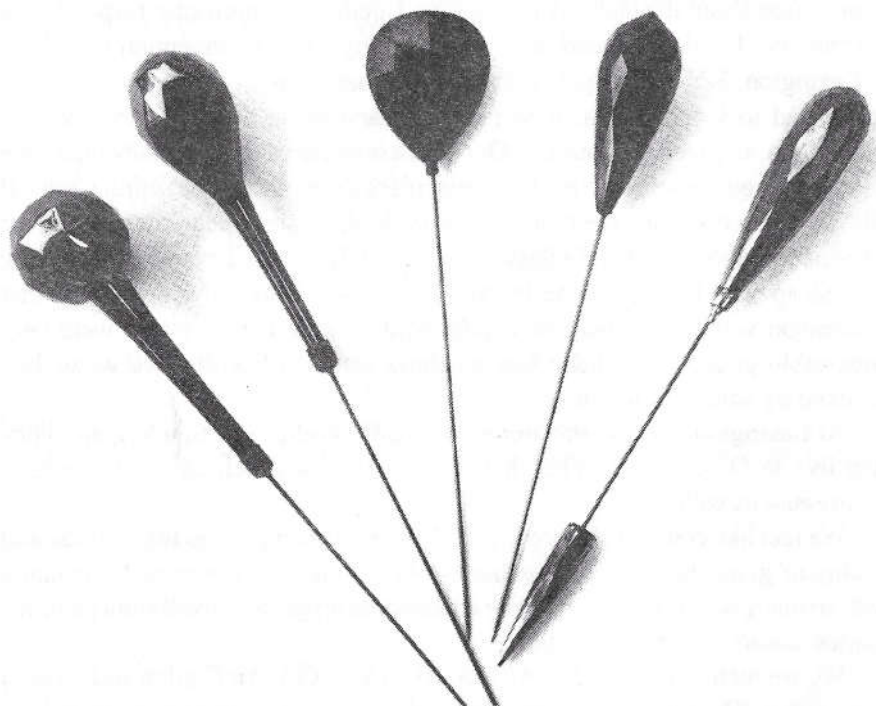
We have set out to learn as much as we can about Carnival Glass. We continue to acquire every book on the subject that we can. Knowledge is essential for the collector. What is rare? What is desirable? What is a fair price? All of these questions enter into making a wise purchase. We passed up some bargains when we first began collecting because of a lack of knowledge. An example was passing up a perfect frosty white Hearts & Flowers bowl for 90.00. Now our trips include the taking of selected reference material. Actually, our vehicle could easily be mistaken for the Bookmobile!

Our collection is a general one. We enjoy all shapes and colors in Carnival Glass. The thing we now strive for is any piece with great iridescence at a reasonable price. The piece of glass that Debbie would most like to own, if price were no object, is an electric blue Hearts & Flowers bowl with a pie-crust edge. I would like to own a purple Garden Path Varient bowl with super iridescence.



## FASCINATING FACETED GLASS HATPINS

Faceted glass hatpins have long been of special interest to me. They shimmer with iridescent colors in a hatpin arrangement. They also seem to pick up different colors when they are turned into different light. This is due to the prism cuts. The hatpins in the photograph were "always a hatpin, never a button." A piece or two are usually seen in a hatpin collection and only recently found more readily in carnival glass collections. Most of them are found with the striking "blue iris" iridescence or the "purple iris" iridescence. There are also copper, bronze, and silver luster finishes that pick up more colors from their surroundings. This is often confusing to a new collector as these are not iridescent by themselves.

The first hatpin, Diamond Sphere, was named by Rose Presnick of Carnival Glass history fame in her Book III. Diamond Sphere is the most often found true carnival glass type hatpin. It is "blown in the mold" and quite lightweight. The glass portion is about 3 3/4" long. It has a metal cup, and the stem measures another 5 1/4". Both cup and stem are japanned

(blackened).

The second is Oval Sphere. It was blown in the mold. The faceting was part of the mold so the angles have a smooth look to them. This is also true about Diamond Sphere. Both are identical in total length, about 9".

The third hatpin is not in any hatpin publication. I call it Lollipop. It is solid glass and weighs twice as much as either Diamond Sphere or Oval Sphere. After it was iridized, the edge was ground to smooth out the rough edges commonly found on these smaller molded pieces. The glass is about 1 3/4" long and quite flat. It has a common finding, that little brass piece where the 5 1/4" stem is attached. Both finding and stem are japanned.

The fourth piece, not as heavy as Lollipop and not as lightweight as Diamond or Oval Sphere, is an interesting piece. The faceting is irregular with sharp edges and appears to have been faceted by a glass cutter after the piece was made and before it was iridized. A similar piece can be seen in Jerry Reynolds wonderful book, *Iridescent Hatpins and Holders from the Carnival Glass Era*, page 154. It is called Prismed Tear Drop, but the stem attached to the other end, the rounder end. Maybe a good name for mine would be Reverse Prismed Tear Drop.

The fifth piece appears to have been cut after the glass was molded. The facets are too irregular, uneven and sharper edged to be anything else. This piece has a metal cup with finding and a unique faceted glass nib (protector) at the stem point. The total length is 7 1/2". This piece is not iridized. It is silver luster, the process used near the end of the hatpin era. The luster washes off quite easily. This type of finish is where the confusion lies. Often folks say it is carnival glass. It picks up different colors from the light rays or even from pieces it is beside. To be carnival, it must be iridized and show off its own colors.

This silver luster hatpin is not in any publications so possibly a nice name for it could be "PRISMED OVAL AND DART."

These fantastic, fascinating, faceted hatpins surely were a fad for the fashionable ladies of the hatpin era. I'd love to hear from anyone who has more information on these faceted hatpins.

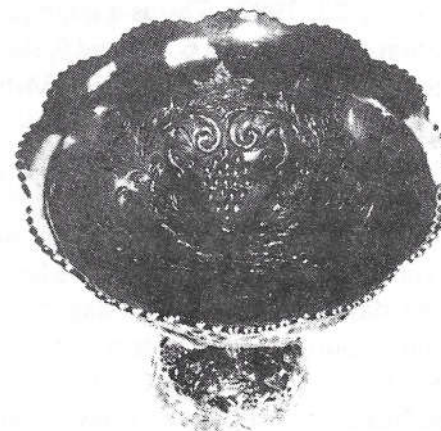

The outside pattern is very common and well known, but it is the interior pattern that has only been found on one item. How many people have guessed it yet??? Are you ready to throw the book at me??? Soooooorry, but I MUST keep you guessing somehow.

It is "Multi Fruits and Flowers" with Scroll and Grape interior. This is the only one known with this interior. According to Edward's book the actual name it goes by is "Scroll and Grape". As you can see the iridescence is not the best ever seen, but having seen it personally, it looks as if it was used a lot. It probably had something with a high acid content in it.



The interior pattern is very beautiful and what a shame that Millersburg did not use it more. Scroll and Grape is such a flowing pattern and very easy on the eyes.

This punch bowl was shown in the Mickey Reichel Auction on Saturday, December 7, 1996, #20. Said it was a "ONE OF A KIND". Shortly after that auction it found its new home here in CA with a fairly new collector. Congratulations goes to Mr. Hanes of Santa Rosa. This is one of three "only one known's" that he has picked up in the past few months. Stay tuned in the future for his other great delights.

## H.O.A.C.G.A. - CLUB INFORMATION

- \* Members are encouraged to bring glass for Sale.
- \* Educational Seminars are provided by members.
- \* A Major Carnival Glass Auction is provided.
- \* The Convention offers members an opportunity to meet new collectors, renew old friendships and enjoy discussing carnival glass with other knowledgeable collectors.
- \* A banquet is held with a Carnival Collector as our Speaker.
- \* A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.

It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.

In order to obtain our objective, the members must financially support the organization. The Heart of America Carnival Glass Association receives its financial support through the Annual Membership dues and the sale of the following.

- \* **Membership Dues** - \$25.00 per year - U.S. & Canada. \$40.00 per year for Foreign. The Membership Year is from the date of joining to

one year later. Dues are set by the Board of Directors to support the publication of the monthly bulletin, typing, printing and mailing.

In 1975, HOACGA decided to make the Grape & Cable red whiskey decanter and shot glasses as a souvenir. The only experience that we had at making a souvenir was the water pitcher and tumblers which were made in 1974 and 1975 by the Indiana Glass Company. We made inquiries to several glass companies that were in business at that time. Only the Fenton Art Glass Company was willing to discuss the possibility of making such a souvenir. When I called the Fenton Art Glass Company, the telephone operator connected me with Frank Fenton. He told me of the problems associated with making such a souvenir. But, since I was totally ignorant of the process and/or problems with making such a piece of glass, I did not see any problems with making such a souvenir since Frank knew all about what it took to do the job. Regardless of his concerns he did consent to meet with us.

When the totally "uninformed" HOACGA Souvenir committee arrived at the Fenton factory on the appointed day, we were escorted to Frank Fenton's office. At that time Frank was the President of the Fenton Glass Company. We had sketches of the whiskey decanter and shot glass that we were interested in having made. Frank proceeded to explain all of the problems associated with making this souvenir. Frank's telephone kept ringing, his secretary would take messages for him, people were wanting to see him, but he continued to talk to us about making the souvenir as if our project was the most important thing that he had to do that day. After several hours of discussion, he then took time to tour us through the factory so we could see glass being made. During this day's discussion we knew that we had a unique opportunity to talk with a man that was truly interested in helping.

Since that time, I have had many opportunities to visit with Frank, both personally and on the telephone. As it was with the first visit, he still exhibits the same interest in helping with the clubs' concerns and needs.

I know that many of the Carnival Clubs, even one in England, have called on Frank for advice and help making a souvenir, whimsey, table favor, or some other special need that they have. I doubt that he has ever turned down many of our requests. He is always willing to get involved with all of the requests from the various clubs.

The carnival glass collectors and organizations have benefited tremendously by have the support and help of a very unselfish and good friend. This benefit is not only from his help with having souvenirs, whimseys, or special pieces of glass made, but also in the form of information that he has supplied through personal discussions, and as a speaker at various club functions. He has been willing to share his personal knowledge about glass making with the collector. There is no place else this kind of detailed information can be obtained.

All carnival collectors and organizations owe Frank a very sincere "thank you" for all of the help, advice, and information that he has so generously supplied to our hobby. We look forward to many more years of his friendly help and association.



