The book contains educational information on about 150 different patterns and it also contains a list of approximately 500 rarities (only 5 or less known). This type of information is not found in any other carnival reference material.


It is a very informative book.

#### **EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES**

#### ENAMELED SILVER BAND

The Silver Band tumbler is illustrated in the photo above. About two years ago a full water set in this pattern was found in a Topeka antique shop. We saw that set and found a single tumbler on our wat to a convention one time. These are the only examples of the Silver Band pattern pieces that we have seen in 28 years of collecting tumblers.

In the photo on the facing page, we show the Silver Band tumbler along with the double Daisy and Silver Queen pattern tumblers. All three of these tumblers appear to be made form the same mold. All have 10 interior panels and all have the plain base. The only difference I can see is the enameled decoration that was applied to them. Since the Double Daisy and Silver Queen patterns are contributed to Fenton, I believe that the Silver Band pieces were also made by that company.



I might mention that Jane Dinkins wrote about and illustrated the Silver Band tumbler and water pitcher in the April 1995 Texas Carnival Glass Club newsletter. The pieces she shows are a part of the set that we refer to in this article. The set is owned by Ken and Aileen Openlander of Manhattan, Kansas. It is in good marigold color with nice iridescence.

The Enameled Silver Band tumbler is #238 in our Educational Tumbler Series. Next month we will feature the Single Rose tumbler.

#### RAISED CHESTNUTS

#### By Gerald Thomas

Raised Chestnuts is the original Northwood pattern name for what we, as collectors, commonly refer to as Acorn Burrs. See "Harry Northwood, The Wheeling Years 1901-1925," page 67 as a reference. A little Carnival glass trivia to start off this article. My article is actually about the rarity and pricing of Acorn Burrs punch sets.

Before I start discussing punch sets, a comment about glass rarities and values. When one expresses an opinion about old glassware quantities and values, it is rather difficult to be precise. Only through access to old glass factory production records or first hand knowledge of glassware items produced, is it possible to report on known glass quantities and colors without error.

Since we cannot easily quantify how much glass exists in a particular pattern or color, we therefore cannot be exact in predicting glass values. many have tried with limited success. I wanted to share this thought before moving on.

I have been collecting Acorn Burrs carnival since 1988. I decided to share what pertinent information I do have concerning Acorn Burrs punch bowl sets availability and values for perfect sets with excellent color. My estimates on availability and values are shown below:

I endeavored to estimate a value for the Aqua Opalescent punch set, but how does one go about doing this when only one known perfect punch set exists! Based

on sales data of other glass rarities, the \$86,000.00 figure cited might be conservative. And, to be honest the owners of glass rarities, including some of the punch sets listed above may not sell their glass now or for the foreseeable future. Since we have no annual "market data" to go by in estimating prices for one of a kind glass rarities., we can only speculate what some glass pieces might be worth. With respect to the Ice Blue sets, I and a few other collectors feel 10 to 15 sets exist. Of the known sets, approximately 40 percent do possess some imperfections or damage, so we, as collectors might be lucky to find 5 to 8 perfect Ice Blue sets. Looking at sales data over the years, I find it difficult to prove that there are more Ice White sets than Ice Blue. If there is a variance in quantity, it is insignificant. I feel that Ice White sets should sell for 80 to 90 percent of what Ice Blue sets sell for. Ice White punch sets in my humble opinion are somewhat undervalued. Blue Acorn Burrs punch sets are difficult to write about. I have never seen one, though I have been told through second hand information that 1 complete set exist and a punch bowl top is owned by one individual and a base is owned by another person. Under this scenario, I will refrain from making a price estimate for the set(s). Northwood probably did manufacture a few punch sets in blue, simply because blue punch cups do periodically show up for sale. Earlier this year four punch cups were sold at auction in Virginia.

The green punch sets which possess the glass color also found in water sets and table sets is readily available. It does take time and effort to locate a quality, perfect set. I have observed a variation in base glass color among green punch sets. A few green punch sets do appear to have a better quality base glass color, a dark emerald green. Looking at the availability of glass on the market and through a casual discussion I had with a prominent Carnival glass auctioneer, I do believe that marigold Acorn Burr punch sets are scarcer than the amethyst sets. Glass prices do not always reflect this. Often purple or amethyst sets sell for more money than marigold, with the exception of one dark marigold set which sold for \$2,600 in 1995 - an exceptional piece of glass. Marigold punch sets do vary in color, and I suspect the lighter colored marigold examples are priced less than the purple sets due to dark marigold being preferred to light marigold by most collectors.

A few concluding remarks. Northwood's Acorn Burrs pattern (in all colors) is frequently in high demand whenever quality specimens are sold. The popularity of Acorn Burrs (especially in the pastel colors) is reflected by high dollar sales prices. I wrote this article for general information purposes and for the membership's reading pleasure. I do make the disclaimer that I assume no responsibility for any financial transactions made as the result of pricing or rarity information provided. Buying and selling decisions are best left to the individual using his or her own personal judgement. Happy glass hunting.

What you are about to read came from a very expensive full-color book entitled "Tiffany Favrile Art Glass", by Moise S. Steeg, Jr. just newly released by Schiffer Publishing Company. Its subject matter is art glass by Tiffany. The chapter that I quote from is Chapter III -- Iridescent Glass Origins" on page No. 45, with a full-color page of a picture of the inside of a bowl on page 47 and also a full-color page dedicated to the reverse (outside) of this bowl on page No. 48. Each picture has beside it in Italic type the words, "Italian Vase, c. 1896."

Now that I have given you the basics there is one more vital piece of information you need to make this pertinent to our collecting field -- this piece of iridized glass to which three full pages are dedicated to is noone other than Northwood's Fine Cut & Roses pattern in a flared out 6 ruffled bowl in purple.

I will now quote the text relating to this piece:

"The following comparison may throw some light on Tiffany's source for iridescent glass.

This vase was brought to the United States by immigrants from Sicily in 1896. The shape and design is similar to some of the Tiffany pieces. The brightly burnished glass finish and the beveled edge are also similar to some of Tiffany's work. This could very well be called a flower form if you were to limit yourself to the upper portion. The three-footed base, however, takes away some of the authenticity as a flower form. It is hexagonal in shape with the six curved and heavily fluted areas. Its color is a burnished luminescent golden brown, but in certain lights shows blues and greens as do many of the Tiffany pieces. Reversed, however, it is particularly interesting. It is decorated on its under side with freeform floral designs and waving stems, and in the very center, a large triangular graded section contraindicated with the three feet and the very center of its underside is decorated in the same way, indicating it was skillfully blown.

By comparing the European vase with a similar vase made by Tiffany, you can clearly see Tiffany's devotion to "nature's forms". Though similar in shape and use, and each with its individual beauty, the Tiffany vase has a true flower form -- from stem, to bud, to bloom -- not a bloom affixed to a top to form a prosaic three-footed compote.


This could well be one of the types of European glass which so attracted Tiffany and which formed the incentive, if not the inspiration, for his iridescent glass."

Well, isn't this interesting. What Carnival glass sought to copy in Tiffany glass has now been attributed in this text as what Tiffany may have copied, or at least formed the incentive and inspiration for his iridescent glass.

Apparently, someone told this poor author that this bowl came over from Sicily -- no less -- in 1896, and he believed it.

So there -- you can't always believe what is written. Certainly not in this case. But we also known one more thing for certain, and that is that Northwood produced a beautifully iridized bowl that fooled some people into believing it to be art glass.

Of course, WE all know how beautiful Carnival glass can be, don't we!!!



#### **HOBSTAR AND FRUIT PATTERN**

The Hobstar and Fruit pattern in shown above in the card tray shape with the rare marigold over milk glass color. It is shown turned on its side in that photo. Photo #2 illustrates it in the sitting up position. We have seen only two of these in that color during our many years of collecting carnival glass. The first was in a room at one of the conventions back east where it was in a display and was not for sale. Later while viewing the Bert and Iva Rambo collection of Long Lane, Missouri, we spotted the second one of these that we have seen. It too, was not for sale. They were getting older and were thinking about having an auction.

A few years later they called us that they were selling their-carnival glass at auction. The auction was held at St. Louis, Missouri Harley Hotel on March 25, 1995 by John Woody. We were happy to be able to but the piece from that auction. It cost us 350.00, so I guess that there were some others there that like it too.



The featured Hobstar and Fruit piece is in the true card tray shape. The ends are only 5/8 of an inch high, so it was not made to hold sauce or berries. The highest point in the center is 2 inches high. The collar base or marie is 2½ inches in diameter. The base color is true milk glass and is completely opaque. It contains a swirled beaded type pattern on the bottom that is raised and not pressed into the glass.


The outside of the pattern contains eight panels, each separated with a row of beads. Four of these panels feature a different type of fruit which include grapes, strawberries, cherries and blackberries. These fruit panels have a stippled background. The four other panels that alternate with the fruit panels contain a hobstar. The background of these panels is not stippled. The interior of the piece is plain and it has beautiful iridescence on both sides.

Another piece that we have in this pattern is the little sauce dish in blue opalscent. You don't see many of these in that color and we think that they are very pretty. The Hobstar and Fruit pattern was made by the Westmoreland Glass Company.

The Hobstar and Fruit card tray marks our 228th entry into the Pictorial Pattern Parade. Next month we will feature the small Sailboats plate in blue.

#### THREE FRUITS MEDALLION

Whether this falls under the classification of scarce, rare or who cares, this is a bowl that is not seen everyday. This beautiful Northwood bowl is white, stippled, and spatula footed with the Meander pattern on the exterior. The iridescent colors are a delight to see under a halogen light source. Pinks and blues with some magenta mixed in give this bowl a magical influence that has to please the most persnickety glass collector.

We found this bowl in a local antique shop and that reinforces our belief that not all the good glass has to be purchased at outrageous prices in glass auctions. There is still nice glass surfacing now and then that can be purchased at affordable price levels. Yes, it does take lots of looking but that is the fun of the hunt. Collecting is supposed to be an enjoyable pastime, and still can be. - not a competition on who can spend the most money. New carnival glass collectors should not be disheartened by the wild prices. There are still many nice low end items, and the occasional rarity, that can be found and enjoyed by true collectors, without putting a mortgage on the house.

As an example, only yesterday we found a reportedly rare white bon bon called Rose Banquet made by Fenton. This was in a well traveled antique mall in Illnois. And we are indebted to the HOACGA Educational Series III Book. This rare bon bon is pictured on page 8 in an article by Dean & Diane Fry.

Without the book we might have passed it by as just another bon bon. These books are loaded with information that all serious collectors should be taking advantage of. This bon bon was rated by the Frys as number one in their top ten list of bon bon rarities in the Sept. 92 issue of the HOACGA bulletin. Many of the club bulletins contain a wealth of knowledge.

October 4, 1997: After some recent surgery it was auction time again for Harold Cox. I stopped in Fort Wayne and together we headed for Lapeer, Michigan. The Albrechts had a good sale lined up, and it drew a large crowd proving once again it doesn't take a mega auction to attract carnival people. There was something for everyone this time with maybe a little too much of the "Stippled Rays bowl" category. The owners seemed pleased with the results and were genuinely surprised at some of the prices.

This was the second sale in a month to offer a pair of Crucifix candle sticks. This set, with minor damage to one, brought \$1,500. The 3 in 1 edge Farmyard bowl was nice and sold for \$7,000. The buy of the sale was probably the white Acorn Burrs punch bowl set at \$4,000. I bought the green Hobstar sugar (\$100) and spooner (\$100) to round out my set and got a good match.

October 16-19, 1997: Air Capital Carnival Glass Club Convention at Wichita, Kansas. The convention was dedicated to the memory of Roland Kuhn who had recently passed away. This, as far as we know, is the only known bowl in this pattern. If anyone else out there in the Carnival glass world has one or knows of one of these bowls, please let us know.


It has been named Lynn's Mums by the owner. It was found by Lynn and Sam Lewis of Richland, Washington at one of the Expo antique fairs in Portland, Oregon in about the year 1989.


It is a Northwood bowl in purple with gorgeous all-over iridescence. It is three-footed (scroll foot), and has the Northwood Ruffles and Rings exterior pattern, a mold purchased from the Jefferson Glass CO. The mums are like the ones found on the Northwood advertising pieces.

It is an 8 ruffled bowl with six open flowers and 5 flowers from a side view with interlacing vines, leaves, and buds throughout.


No one that has seen this bowl has ever seen this pattern before. The iridization is quite beautiful, with the pattern quite simple yet effective within the bowl center.
