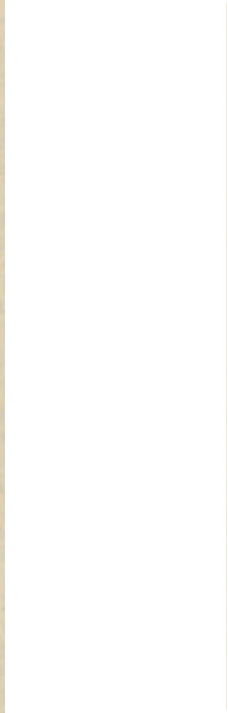
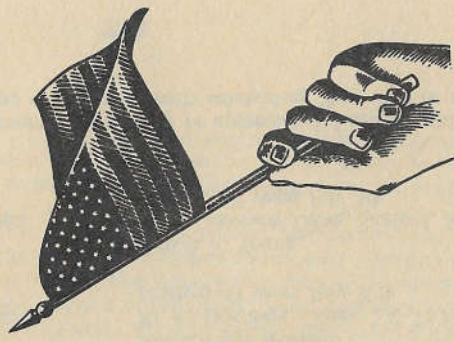

The 1998 HOACGA souvenir is the "Orange Tree" Loving Cup in White carnival. This is one of the more famous Fenton patterns. The Loving Cup was originally made in Amethyst, Blue, Green, Marigold, White, a Peach Opal, a Smokey Blue, and an Aqua Opalescent.

A limited edition of only 225 of the Loving Cups was made. They are marked on the bottom as commemorating the club's "25th Anniversary". We wanted to have the Loving Cup made in a silver (smoke) color in keeping with the club's anniversary, but the closest we could get to that was the beautiful white carnival. We think this is very fitting for the club's 25th convention anniversary.

The cost of the souvenir is \$40.00 plus \$3.00 for U.S.A. shipping. We believe that you will enjoy owning one of these souvenirs.

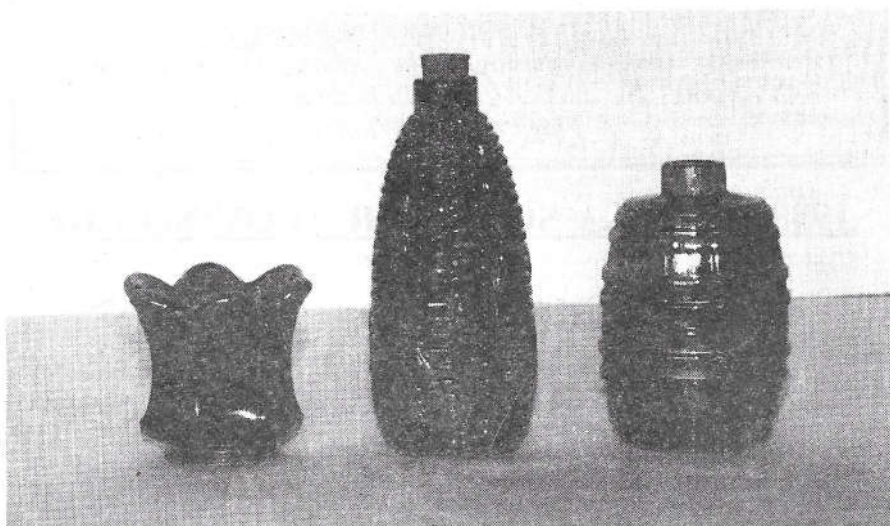

THE LITTLE THINGS

What do you do when you start running out of space? Collect little things, of course. Two couples noted for their miniature collections are Jack & Eleanor Hamilton and the late John Britt and his wife Lucile. Many people, we are sure, have enjoyed their displays and interesting programs presented at past HOACGA conventions.

We just attended a Seeck Auction where a master Northwood Grape & Cable punch bowl and base was sold. What a beautiful example of carnival glass! But where do you put it? Who is strong enough to even pick it up? Just getting it home in one piece could be a real problem. A well known Wisconsin collector resolved this dilemma some years back by donating his master punch bowl set to the Corning Museum of Glass in Corning, NY for public display.

Pictured above are three Imperial little things a person can enjoy and always squeeze into the curio cabinet. These three items are a pleasing dark marigold but the challenge is to find them in other colors. The corn bottles are also known in helios green and smoke. The Little Barrel also comes in the same three colors. The Imperial toothpick holders are found in marigold, green and amethyst as well as a seldom seen cobalt blue. Carl Burns book on Imperial Glass reports other rare colors such as aqua, vaseline, and lime green. The toothpicks are a challenge

to find without tiny nicks. Recently, a blue Flute toothpick holder was sold at the Mildred Markley auction held by Tom Burns in Ohio.

People have a wide choice of "little things" to collect. A collection of sauce dishes is interesting and a challenge to collect in all patterns and colors. Certainly sauce dishes take up much less space than their large counterparts. Small vases always generate enthusiastic bidding at glass auctions. Miniature Ripple and Morning Glory vases are always favorite items with collectors. Other possibilities include punch cups, wine glasses, cordials, tumblers, mugs and novelty items.

So if you are running out of space, think small! There are lots of enjoyable items in carnival glass that one can collect without your collection taking over your house.

I am no expert about Carnival, but I have learned a lot in the past year. I know they say knowledge is power. With collecting this is very true, or very costly whichever way you look at it.

I learned a lot from talking to other collectors. Also, I bought every carnival book I could find. (I have a lot of them.) I learned about the history of making glass and the real personal side of the people who made this beautiful glass.

I encourage you to learn and love the glass within your budget. It is very easy to get so caught up in carnival that you can stretch the budget to the limit or maybe over if you're not careful. So beware this is like an addiction, so don't let it control you. Enjoy the glass and make plans as to what is within your budget.

There is a lot of beautiful glass out there and if you can't afford a certain piece, in time you will find another one or something even more special. So don't get discouraged, this is a great hobby. Some use it as an investment or income. Myself I love it and it is a hobby right now, but of course, I hope to one day make it a good investment when it comes time to sell. Which will hopefully be a long ways down the road.

I love the clubs, I belong to five right now. I may choose to join more. You can learn a lot from the materials in them. If you are lucky enough to go to a convention or an auction, "it's just great", the excitement is "unbelievable." I love the auctions. You will want to get on the auction mailing lists. Even if you can't attend you can send in mail order bids. But from past experience, I don't care to mail bid, because once I have actually viewed the glass, I always end up bidding for things that I would not have bid for sitting in my home. To see the glass and it's colors and it's minor flaws makes quite a difference to making a purchase. I also buy more when I actually go to the auctions, so beware that is a very likely possibility too.

Just remember, learn as much as you can, spend wisely and within your budget. Also, glass condition means a lot when it comes to reselling down the road. Color is everything, good even color and nice iridescence. Damage must be very, very minor to hold a good value. Manufacturing flaws if they don't take away from the beauty of the piece do not hurt the values much. Of course, perfect color and perfect condition is wonderful, but sometimes to get something you want you may find at times you will settle for something less than perfect. After all, this glass has been around a lot of years and if it could only talk, think of the neat stories we could enjoy. But we can enjoy the glass without the stories. Us collectors get to tell the stories of our wonderful finds. Carnival Glass collectors are good people, I am happy to be in their clubs.

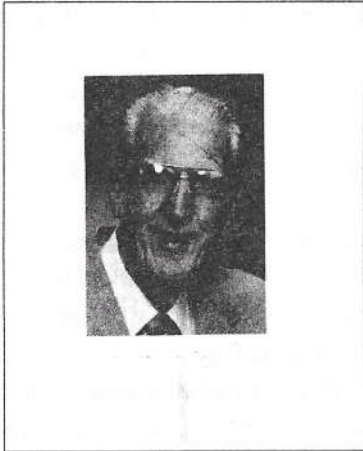

FROM MEMORY AND FILES

FENTON LOOK-ALIKES STAG & HOLLY LARGE BOWLS WITH THREE FEET



At least two different Stag & Holly bowls are showing up in the marketplace and are being sold as old Fenton pieces. Some are in Red Carnival, Blue Carnival, and a Mandarin Red color. How can you tell them from the old pieces?

All of the stags on the old Fenton piece have a very visible tongue showing in the mouth of the stag. The new ones don't show the tongue. An even simpler way to tell the difference is that at the base of the holly stems are three little berries. On the Fenton pieces, two of those stems have one berry at the bottom and two right above it. On the other two stems, there are two berries at the bottom with one berry above.

On the new pieces, there either is one stem with no berries at the bottom, or we also have stems with each stem having two berries at the bottom with one above it. I asked John Saffell to take a rubbing from the Fenton original Stag & Holly bowl showing the location of the berries for you to know what to look for. Following this article (on page 10) is a sketch of a red carnival Stag & Holly three-toed bowl which recently appeared in Illinois that has one of the stems with no berries at the bottom.

BUTTERFLY & BERRY LARGE BOWL WITH THREE BALL AND CLAW FEET

This is the larger of the two Fenton Butterfly & Berry bowls which has a design in the inside of the piece showing a butterfly in the center and leaves and berries in the bottom of the piece. The easiest way to tell the difference between the reproduction and the Fenton is to look at the butterfly in the center of the piece. The butterfly wings have small knobs (tiny nobs) on them, easily recognized. The reproduction has five hobs on each side of the butterfly wings. The Fenton butterfly has six of those little hobs on each side, a total of 12 hobs. The body of the Fenton butterfly is small and more delicate than the body of the reproduction butterfly, but that doesn't help you if you don't have both pieces. Just count the little knobs (hobs) and you'll know which is which. The reproduction I have is made in iridized French Opalescent.

FENTON'S WHEAT VASE

This is a switch from somebody copying Fenton's old piece. In this case, Fenton has copied an early Czechoslovakian vase that was made in a vasa-murrhina type treatment. I bought the piece many years ago at the Denver Antique show and brought it home. We make our own vase putting more glass up in the top of the piece so that we would have room to do the typical fancy crimping and styling we do. Fenton has not made its vase in the vasa-murrhina treatment.

ON THE AUCTION TRAIL WITH CHUCK

May 30, 1998: Seeck Auction at Wentzville, Missouri. Another mail bidder's auction. The crowds at the run-of-the-mill non-convention auction seem somewhat smaller than what I expect to see. I am not ready to buy the theory that there are too many auctions because the glass always sells and if it is a desirable pattern or shape with good color and condition the price is adequate. It has long been an opinion of mine that sooner or later the sheer abundance of mail bids will change the attitude of the casual auction goer. Has it happened? I have often heard the statement "I can't outbid the mail bidder who has no travel expense, etc." Now that we often see multiple mail bids on an item, the audience is left out and some of the auction tempo is lost. I do not have an answer, but it looks like we are going through another phase and I hear the word "Internet" popping up very frequently.

At this auction there was one super nice piece that caught my eye. It was a 12" Lined Lattice vase with rectangular feet at \$325. It was probably the most outstanding piece in the auction, regardless of price. The 6" Ballard Merced, Cal. advertising plate (\$2,200), white Dandelion pitcher (\$2,000), and 8 piece Memphis fruit bowl set at \$875 were some of the examples that escaped the mail bidders. As I left, I wondered what this auction would have been like without the mail bids.

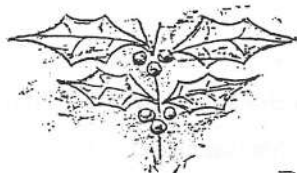

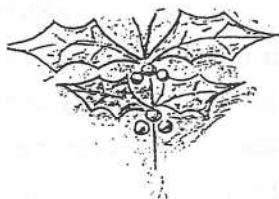

BUYING & SELLING - RETURN PRIVILEGE ADVERTISEMENT POLICY

By Bob Grissom

One of the many benefits of being a member of HOACGA is the opportunity to buy, and/or sell, and to advertise in the monthly bulletin for pieces that you want. In order for this opportunity to be satisfactory to both the buyer and seller, it has to be one of mutual respect and honesty. To date, the officers of HOACGA have tried to set out some simple guidelines, so the buyer and seller can reach a mutual agreement as to the terms of the sale and purchase. Item #6 of the "HOACGA BULLETIN ADVERTISEMENT POLICY" states "A 5 DAY RETURN PRIVILEGE, AT BUYER'S EXPENSE, PROVIDING IT IS NOT AS ADVERTISED, OR AS DISCUSSED."

In the last few months, several complaints have been received regarding the purchase and returning of unsatisfactory and unacceptable pieces of glass. This subject was discussed at the Annual Meeting on April 23, 1998. Members in attendance generally agreed that those members who do not abide by the return-privilege policy should not be allowed to advertise in the bulletin.

Effective immediately, the HOACGA Board of Directors, in an attempt to deal with complaints, has adopted the following rules.

- If a member receives a piece of carnival, and he exercises his right to return the piece within the allowed time, the sender/seller is obligated to make a complete refund within five days after receipt of the returned piece of glass.
- If the refund is not made, the buyer can write a letter to the Board of Directors (Secretary) stating his complaint.
- This complaint will be reviewed and a letter will then be sent to the seller about the complaint.
- The seller will then be given ten days to notify the HOACGA Secretary of what action was taken to correct the complaint.
- If the complaint is not corrected within the required time, no further advertisements will be accepted from that member. Advertisements will not be allowed again until the problem has been resolved.

It is regretful that this type of action is required. It causes more work for those involved with the administration of the organization. We do not need to tolerate any unfair dealing among collectors/members. Carnival Glass collecting can only survive if members deal fairly with each other. **THERE IS NO PLACE FOR THOSE WHO WISH TO DEAL UNFAIRLY.**

H.O.A.C.G.A. BULLETIN
ADVERTISEMENT POLICY

1. All advertisements of glass for SALE or WANTS must be received by the Bulletin Secretary no later than the LAST DAY OF THE MONTH to insure being published in the next bulletin.
2. Members may advertise ten (10) "For Sale" and/or "Wants" per month. The "For Sale" Glass must be members glass and not the property of a nonmember. Advertising is at no cost.
3. Only "OLD CARNIVAL GLASS" items or H.O.A.C.G.A. Souvenirs will be published.
4. Damage or flaws should be noted.
5. All "For Sale" items must be priced; **NO BID ITEMS WILL BE PUBLISHED.**
6. A 5 day return privilege, at buyer's expense, providing it is not as advertised, or as discussed.
7. Postage and Insurance is to be the responsibility of the buyer, both when returning and receiving the glass.
8. The sender of the glass (be it the seller or the buyer returning it) is responsible for the proper packaging of the glass.
9. When submitting FOR SALE and WANTED ads, please write legibly so that your ad can be read; spell out words as opposed to using abbreviations. Your ad will be formatted to fit as best as possible. Items will be limited to one line, unless you are advertising less than ten items.
****IMPORTANT**** - be sure to include your name, address & phone number **on the ad itself.**
