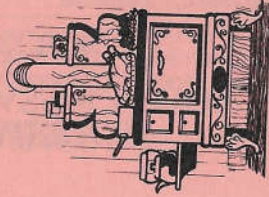
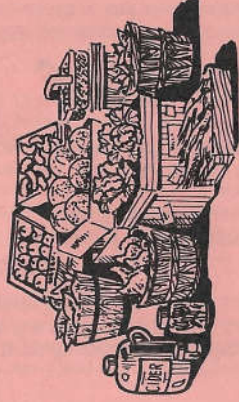

The 1998 HOACGA souvenir is the "Orange Tree" Loving Cup in White carnival. This is one of the more famous Fenton patterns. The Loving Cup was originally made in Amethyst, Blue, Green, Marigold, White, a Peach Opal, a Smokey Blue, and an Aqua Opalescent.

A limited edition of only 225 of the Loving Cups was made. They are marked on the bottom as commemorating the club's "25th Anniversary". We wanted to have the Loving Cup made in a silver (smoke) color in keeping with the club's anniversary, but the closest we could get to that was the beautiful white carnival. We think this is very fitting for the club's 25th convention anniversary.

The cost of the souvenir is \$40.00 plus \$3.00 for U.S.A. shipping. We believe that you will enjoy owning one of these souvenirs.

SAILBOAT WINE & VARIANT

I know what you're thinking, another variant. Well, so what, it could be worse.

The story thus far, after purchasing 1 of 5 vaseline Sailboat wines from an Alabama collector last year, I thought since there are only marigold & blue left I'll just try and find these 2 colors with excellent mold detail. This was not a piece of cake, but I finally found them - both with super mold work.

Now, as soon as I found the blue one (left in the above photo), I knew something was different. Placing them side by side, it was obvious. The marigold was 1/8" taller & much lighter weight than the blue. Here come the big differences (not as difficult as it sounds).

The marigold example on the right has a swirled stem that has a rope-like texture, whereas the blue variant has a smooth surface. The quickest way to tell is to look below the ovals which contain the sailboat design. You'll notice a filler pattern about 3/8" which encircles the piece just above the stem and around the top. The blue variant does not have this filler, it is plain.



There are other major differences inside the ovals on both pieces.

The regular (marigold) wine has two mountain peaks, each containing a tree on top of each peak, whereas the blue variant has two mountain peaks with a large tree in the center of the two peaks. Also the waves are different on both pieces. Other differences are the sails on the boats vary, the palm tree to the left of the boats sails are different and the blue variant has a half moon above the sail. (They were sailing at night.)

Close examination will show other slight variances.

So if you collect 2 sailboat wines, you may need to look a little closer to see which one you have.

BARBELLA

“What's that,” you say. “Must be one of those European patterns.” Actually, it's a pattern made by Northwood. True, it's not a very well known pattern. Probably, because the name Barbella is not what these pieces are normally called. Instead, they are named by the flower found enameled to their sides, **Apple Blossoms**. The only pieces called Barbella are topaz opal tumblers.

But, like most other early patterns created by Northwood, Barbella was made in water sets, berry sets and believe it or not, table sets. We recently purchased this beautiful spooner in the Apple Blossoms pattern. It is made of cobalt glass and also has a single petal flower on the reverse side. Quite nice and also rare in our opinion.

Interestingly enough, if you were to compare the Barbella or Apple Blossom pieces to that of the Grape & Gothic Arches, you would find a striking similarity. In fact, it would not be unreasonable to believe that the Barbella mold was reworked to produce the later.

It is going to a long and arduous task to put together this table set! But, that's the fun of it. Isn't it?

MEET DAN AND VICKI GEARHART

If our Carnival Glass hobby is to thrive in the new century that is just ahead, it is important that we continually attract new collectors. One such couple is Dan and Vicki Gearhart of Winthrop, Iowa. They have been collecting for only three years... but, in their own words, they have become "hooked". Vicki has been nice enough to share their story with us.

My husband and I live in a small Iowa town. We have been married three years. We are 36 and 40 years old. I am the oldest and have the most grey hair, but I am very happy. I will start by telling you it was actually my husband who first had the interest in carnival. His mother had two carnival bowls: one Fenton blue Peacock at the Urn ruffled bowl and an Imperial marigold Open Rose ruffled bowl. I really fell in love with the beautiful rose design in the bowl.

One weekend I said, "Let's do something different, let's go look at some shops in the McGregor area." I have driven past those shops off and on for years. So off we went for an hour's drive to get there.

We started walking through the shops, and in one antique mall there was a beautiful Imperial marigold Open Rose plate, for an UNHEARD OF PRICE of SEVENTY DOLLARS. Man, who would be nuts enough, I thought, to spend that much month for an old plate? Crazy! Absolutely crazy. My husband spotted a beautiful green Northwood Strawberry ruffled bowl for - hold onto your hats - ONE HUNDRED AND NINETY FIVE DOLLARS!

Yes, that whole week we both kept thinking about those beautiful pieces. So the next weekend we decided to drive back there and take a better look. Maybe they had something real pretty in our price range like \$10-\$20. Well, wouldn't you know we ended up in the same shop and we came home that day with those 2 pieces plus 3 others. **We were hooked!**

Then I bought a carnival glass book to read and learn patterns. We had just returned from our South Dakota vacation where we purchased 26 pieces of affordable carnival. As we now know, they were not all good buys. We bought overpriced, poor colored glass at first. (We sold 22 pieces at a local auction recently just to get rid of it. We lost money on those 22 pieces, but that is part of learning.) Luckily, we met the Chamberlains in Manchester shortly after we had made a few purchases, and they shared their collection with us and gave us advice about joining clubs and attending conventions.

We are fortunate to have taken the time to educate ourselves, so hopefully in the future our glass will hold it's value or possibly increase. We don't buy for the investment, we buy because we love it. We buy what we like and what we can afford. We both have full time jobs, so we are fortunate to be able to enjoy this hobby. In one year, we have purchased just over 200 pieces. Some not so good, but we like them.

The high points of collecting were spotting that Imperial marigold Open Rose plate, (The high point of my year was meeting the Chamberlains and viewing their **beautiful collection**), the excitement we felt as new collectors going into antique shops for the first time and finding carnival, sometimes a **lot** of carnival, which we absolutely flipped when we first saw curios **FULL** of this glass. (Too bad we are spoiled. The shops don't create that excitement now.) We have seen a lot since we began collecting.

Our first auction, with Jim Seeck - Talk about floating, it was so neat - tables and tables of carnival for sale. Not just the regular carnival you see in the shops, but the good stuff! The stuff I had never seen in my life. Then to continue talking about the "good stuff"... by far the conventions. The rarities you will see only once in a life time.

The HOACGA convention had an auction I will never forget. The glass was absolutely beautiful. The auction was fun with the nice people in charge. That made the auction very enjoyable. Jim Seeck and the crew always are so professional, but even that day it was fun to see the "little boy" in Jimmy Seeck peek out, for just a few minutes, as he laughed so hard he couldn't see. For those that missed the auction, there was a very innocent situation that turned very funny and the whole place, including myself, found ourselves laughing and wiping our eyes. That was just a nice bonus for the day.

I do love the conventions, the people, the glass and the auctions. Not necessarily in that order, I just love the hobby. Now we are going to try to be glass hunters. Try to find a beautiful pieces of glass.



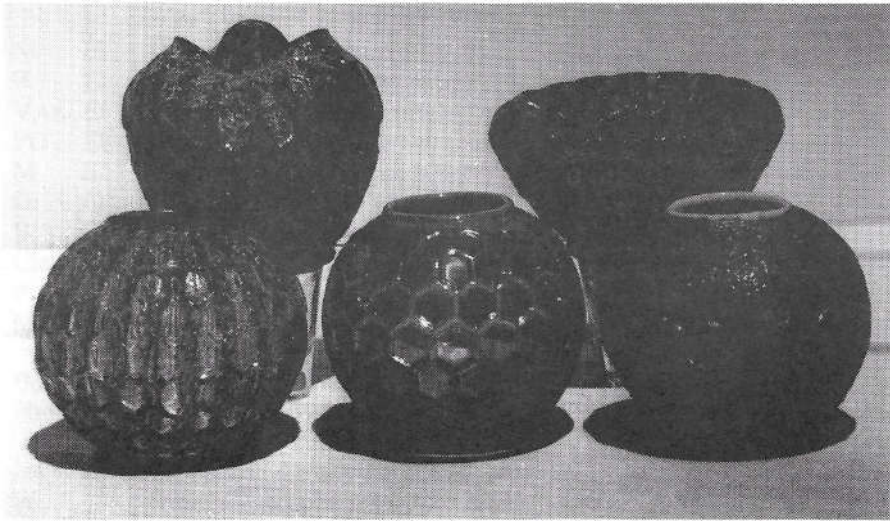

DUGAN'S HONEYCOMB ROSEBOWLS

The Honeycomb rosebowl was at one time reported to be a Millersburg product. Stories circulated of its use as a container for selling honey. Today, we know it was made by the Dugan glass plant in Indiana, Pennsylvania around 1905-1906. Edwards' Standard Encyclopedia of Carnival Glass lists only two colors: marigold and peach opalescent. The peach opal rosebowl is found with varying amounts of opal and can be quite pretty. I have never seen a true marigold Honeycomb rosebowl. What we have seen is slightly peach opal rosebowls listed in auction sale lists as marigold. We would have to conclude that the marigold rosebowl would be a good find and we will keep looking for it.

This Honeycomb pattern is a mould blown shape rather than pressed glass. And was made in other treatments, such as Venetian, Japanese and Pompeian lines besides being made in peach opal carnival glass. Several years ago, Dr. James Measell sent us a black & white photo of a spittoon he saw in Indiana made from the rosebowl mould. He described it as, "color used as the base for peach opal but

was not iridized with the typical spray. It has some very fine amber frit arranged to form vague vertical lines; these pieces seem to be related to Dugan's Japanese and Venetian lines, circa 1905-1906, all of which were attempts to duplicate Loetz-type glass, I think."

The photo shows a typical carnival glass peach opal rosebowl in the center. To its right is a spatter glass rosebowl with gold frit. The spatter glass is best described as an opal (milk) glass with rose pink streaks. Then finished with an iridize spray treatment. The rosebowl on its left was rolled in ruby frit with vertical lines of silver frit. The green spittoon shape and tri-corner pinched in shape was made from the rose bowl pictured as number #389 in the Dugan/Diamond book. Referred to in the book as "iridescent antique green", it was possibly Dugan's early experiments with iridescent glass. This blown glass was more labor intensive than pressed glass. It seems doubtful that the additional cost of making these rosebowls would make them a satisfactory container to sell honey in. Glass items made to merchandise commodities were referred to as "packer goods". Were the spittoons merely glass workers whimsies? Could spittoons exist in peach opal carnival glass?

In 1983, the Dennis Keck sale (A Tom Burns auction) in Columbus, Ohio had four art glass type Honeycomb rosebowls in the sale. One had a flared out top and another with the top pinched in to a tri-cornered shape. All Honeycomb rosebowls are scarce to rare today and considering the additional steps required by the glass workers to make these, they should get more respect than they do.

A big 'thank you' to all the people who helped make this possible and to everyone who attended."

Convention Chairman, Paul Hrics, echoed Kathy's comments: "This was fantastic. Each year we try to make it bigger and better and it takes a lot of work to pull it off. We had over 70 volunteers helping to make this show a success. Add to that the dealers, the guest speakers, the former Imperial employees -- it's quite a team effort. Our satisfaction comes when everyone has a good time. We're looking forward to next year."

Each Convention is indeed different and there was an air of excitement and anticipation as the official festivities commenced Friday evening with the exclusive Imperial auction. Many rarely seen and often one-of-a-kind Imperial items were offered ranging from a Candlewick Muffin Tray to an original 1910 Imperial Glass Company stock certificate.

Saturday morning began with the "business" part of the Convention at the General Membership Meeting. We said good-bye to retiring Board members Richard Ross and Richard Lancino and welcomed new members Ed Lautenschlager and Ed Gustkey. Kathy Doub reiterated the importance of the NIGCS Study Groups toward furthering our goals as an organization and toward establishing an Imperial Museum.

Ron Doll reported that the Museum Committee has continued an exhaustive search for a future site and that the Bellaire Glass & Artifacts Museum has become allied with the NIGCS efforts to that end. Donations have continued toward the Museum Fund and we expressed our gratitude to all contributors, especially O. J. Scherschligt of Mirror Images in Michigan. Mirror Images received permission to reproduce the oval Imperial display sign in limited edition colors and, for each item sold, is donating \$5.00 toward the Museum.

In other news: The *Imperial Glass Encyclopedia Volume-III* should be completed by October of 1999, the NIGCS has a new Web Page ("www.imperialglass.org") and two new videotapes (The History of Imperial & Imperial Carnival Glass) will soon be released.

Following the meeting we were honored to host a question-and-answer session with some of the people who were responsible for creating the Imperial items so dear to us. This is a rare opportunity to gain a glimpse into Imperial's past and hear first-hand experiences and stories from the people who were the Imperial Glass Company.

Next came the much-anticipated Show & Sale. As the doors opened there was a collective gasp as the eyes were met by the hundreds of items of glassware meticulously displayed and ready for purchase. The selection truly represented the finest from Imperial and other companies ranging from a Candlewick gold Punch Set and Family Punch Set to Imperial's FreeHand, Lead Lustre, Carnival, Slag, Cape Cod, Art Glass and something from nearly every line.

The Display was a true potpourri of Imperial glassware. Separated into two groups, the first was "Luncheon With Imperial" featuring several glassware lines arranged in luncheon sets. Second, the main display represented over 100 different glassware lines extending the full 80 years of Imperial's production.

That evening, at the annual Banquet, the opening ceremonies included a special gift from Board members Lucile Kennedy and Betty Jane Muhleman: a huge replica of the Candlewick #400/115/1 3-Light Eagle Candleholder sculpted in ice. This was a beautiful introduction to a wonderful evening. Our guest speaker was the well-known author/editor Dr. James Measell, who has recently become head of archives at the Fenton Art Glass Company. He spoke about the human aspect of glassmaking: "...behind, beside, next to and within every object of Imperial glass there are people."

Dr. Measell went on to relate the pride and sense of accomplishment the glass workers felt when a product was created and how each piece carried a part of the people involved: "This is part of the self-esteem...that made the hand industry what it was. It is not what it was. Most of the factories are gone...Imperial is gone...You may remember what I said in 1995: 'They might tear down the building, but they won't stop the memory of the Big-I.' They did tear down the factory...but that did not diminish the spirit, in fact it multiplied the spirit, of the Big-I, largely because of (people like you) here tonight...Imperial was what it was, they made what they made...but let us not forget who they were...the people of Imperial."

The final day is always bittersweet. "Sweet" because there is one last chance to visit with friends, old and new, and to find that last special piece of Imperial glass. "Bitter" because it is the last day until next year.

The morning began with a most absorbing and informative seminar that delved into the depths of Imperial's rare and lesser-known items. Our "guide" on this journey is best described by Paul Douglas: "Few people enjoy, preserve and enhance the memory of the Big-I the way Willard Kolb does...His efforts in researching and educating people about Imperial...the world of information he has to share and the kind of detail he brings to our knowledge of Imperial glass shows his commitment to our continued education." I describe Willard as a "living, breathing Imperial encyclopedia."

Again the doors opened into the Show & Sale for the last time and, in what seemed like a matter of minutes, it was all over for another year. It was time to reverse the process started such a short time ago and begin preparing for next year. In the words of one of our Society members: "This year was the greatest." I couldn't agree more. Next up, our first-ever Fall Imperial Auction in Bellaire, on Halloween -- please plan to attend.

- * The Convention offers members an opportunity to meet new collectors, renew old friendships and enjoy discussing carnival glass with other knowledgeable collectors.
- * A banquet is held with a Carnival Collector as our Speaker.
- * A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.

It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.

In order to obtain our objective, the members must financially support the organization. The Heart of America Carnival Glass Association receives its financial support through the Annual Membership dues and the sale of the following.

- * **Membership Dues** - \$25.00 per year - U.S. & Canada. \$40.00 per year for Foreign. The Membership Year is from the date of joining to one year later. Dues are set by the Board of Directors to support the

BUYING & SELLING - RETURN PRIVILEGE ADVERTISEMENT POLICY

One of the many benefits of being a member of HOACGA is the opportunity to buy, and/or sell, and to advertise in the monthly bulletin for pieces that you want. In order for this opportunity to be satisfactory to both the buyer and seller, it has to be one of mutual respect and honesty. To date, the officers of HOACGA have tried to set out some simple guidelines, so the buyer and seller can reach a mutual agreement as to the terms of the sale and purchase. Item #6 of the "HOACGA BULLETIN ADVERTISEMENT POLICY" states "A 5 DAY RETURN PRIVILEGE, AT BUYER'S EXPENSE, PROVIDING IT IS NOT AS ADVERTISED, OR AS DISCUSSED."

In the last few months, several complaints have been received regarding the purchase and returning of unsatisfactory and unacceptable pieces of glass. This subject was discussed at the Annual Meeting on April 23, 1998. Members in attendance generally agreed that those members who do not abide by the return-privilege policy should not be allowed to advertise in the bulletin.

Effective immediately, the HOACGA Board of Directors, in an attempt to deal with complaints, has adopted the following rules.

- If a member receives a piece of carnival, and he exercises his right to return the piece within the allowed time, the sender/seller is obligated to make a complete refund within five days after receipt of the returned piece of glass.
- If the refund is not made, the buyer can write a letter to the Board of Directors (Secretary) stating his complaint.
- This complaint will be reviewed and a letter will then be sent to the seller about the complaint.
- The seller will then be given ten days to notify the HOACGA Secretary of what action was taken to correct the complaint.
- If the complaint is not corrected within the required time, no further advertisements will be accepted from that member. Advertisements will not be allowed again until the problem has been resolved.

It is regretful that this type of action is required. It causes more work for those involved with the administration of the organization. We do not need to tolerate any unfair dealing among collectors/members. Carnival Glass collecting can only survive if members deal fairly with each other. **THERE IS NO PLACE FOR THOSE WHO WISH TO DEAL UNFAIRLY.**

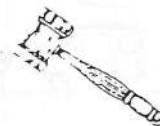

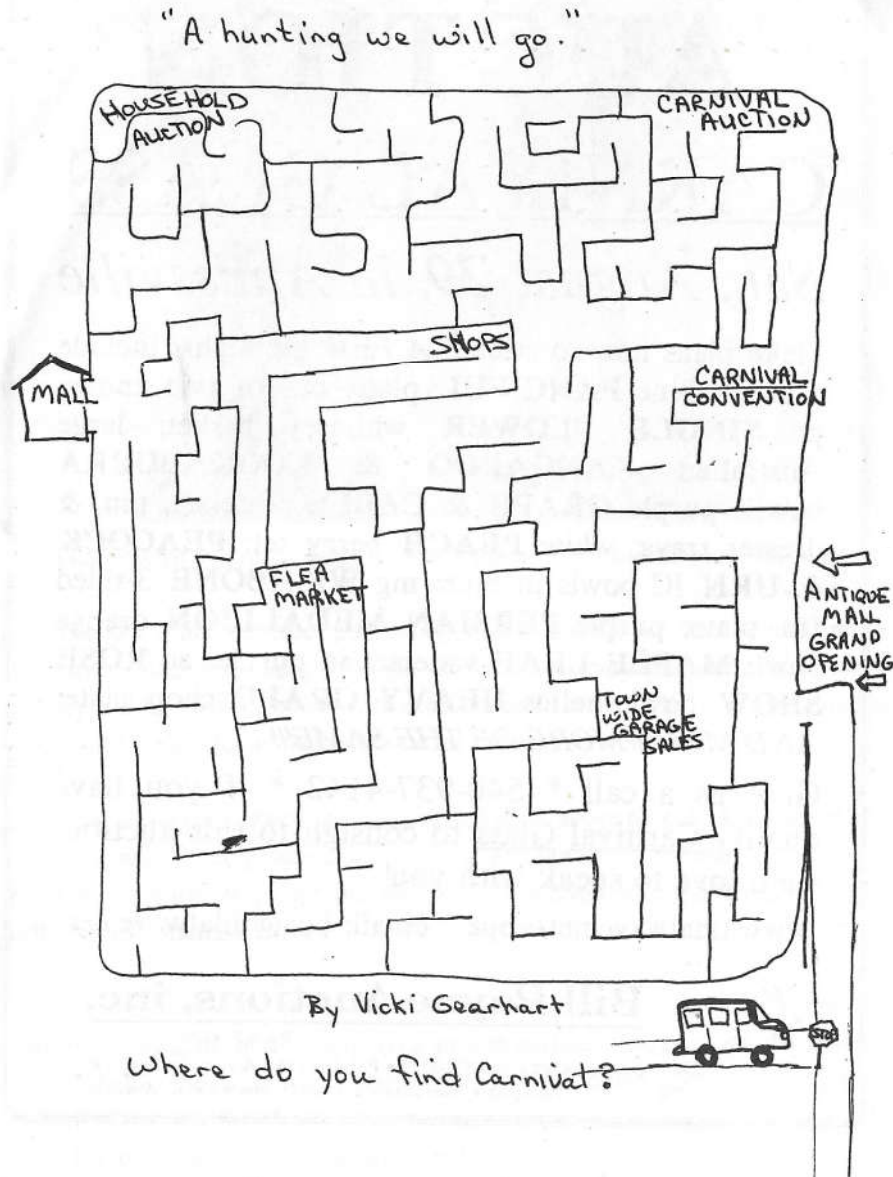
