THE BUTTERFLY & SMOOTH RAYS BON BON

Here are two Northwood amethyst bon bons that we feel are closely related. Both are the smooth back variety, have iridescence front and back, and have the same number serrated edge handles. The Butterfly bon bon is signed with the (N) signature (picture one) and the Smooth Rays bon bon (picture two) is not signed. But upon close examination, they are both unmistakably made by the Northwood Glass Company. We suspect the Butterfly pattern mould may well be a rework of a slower selling "Northwood's Smooth Rays" (our name) bon bon mould.

We can only guess that the Smooth Rays was a slow seller by their relative scarcity today. This is only the second Smooth Rays bon bon we can recall seeing. And we know that the minute you make such a statement, they will turn up everywhere. We can point out that they didn't appear in Carl Burns Northwood Pattern Glass in Color or "Harry Northwood, The Wheeling Years, 1901-1925" by Heacock, Measell, and Wiggins. The Edwards / Carwile book does show a

similar Northwood bon bon that is called Smooth Rays, but has the same Smooth Rays pattern on the front as well as the back. Whether the ray count is the same is difficult to tell. Also the handles on the bon bon shown, appear to have some additional serrations.

Both the Smooth Rays and the Butterfly bon bons have a count of 52 rays each. The Butterfly bon bon has every other ray heavily stippled. And the additional Butterfly motif flying on the heading of 45 degrees to the handles was a nice touch. Making new moulds was a sizeable expense in glass making. Pulling a retired mould from storage and retooling it was probably a very cost effective practice.

These Northwood bon bons were both found recently in antique mall search and rescue missions. The search part is getting tougher, (finding carnival glass at reasonable prices); the rescue, giving it a loving home, is the part we enjoy the most. Maybe we should call picture two the "Absentee Butterfly" bon bon. Just kidding!

SHOPPIN' & HOPIN'

One of the first big thrills of any carnival glass collector will be attending their first convention. Just to give you some highlights of our first one: the preceding Friday we went to a Woody auction at the Harley Hotel in St. Louis. And back on the road, heading for St. Louis and the excitement of the auction. We stopped a few more times, but didn't find anything we needed. We got to the hotel, checked into our room, and rushed down to look at the auction glass set out on display. Wow! Just like a kid in the candy store - all of it looked good. How do you pick out just one thing?? Or even two?? Well, needless to say, we didn't get much sleep that night. We spent a lot of time talking about the pieces we wanted, the prices we wanted to pay, and sometimes, just a guess at what one would go for (like the top items that were way out of our range). Of course, even if we didn't get anything, there was always the convention auction coming up Friday. We're talking fairly new collectors here, folks ... so you know we couldn't get out of there without buying a couple of pieces to add to our collection. And luck was with us, because we picked up a local paper Saturday morning and discovered ANOTHER auction (on Sunday) advertising 50 pieces of carnival glass - in the direction we happen to be traveling! Life doesn't get much better than this: vacations, auctions, and carnival glass. Ahhhh.

What treasures await us at this local auction??? (And maybe nobody else saw the ad! Maybe we'll be the only ones there! Not likely!) We start our normal procedure: got to the auction an hour and a half early (so we can check out the glass and get a really good seat), and start writing down the wonderful patterns that have caught our eye. "Look at the funeral vase - it's a purple Morning Glory!" "Hey! An ice green Peacocks plate; isn't that gorgeous?" "There're some pieces in Butterfly & Berry." "Jeez, I wonder what those candlesticks are?" "Man, this is a lot tougher than when they give you the flyer with the pieces all numbered and identified!" "What do you think the pattern is on this bowl?" The auction finally begins, and when the dust settles, we have purchased four or five more beautiful

things. By now, the car is beginning to be a little crowded for the person in the back seat; boxes of carnival glass are starting to crowd their way into the car.

And onward we go. Boonville, here we come! We heard this Mickey Reichel guy has a lot of nice carnival glass. What an understatement! If memory serves us correctly, we took a few pieces off his hands. He even showed us the glass he had for an upcoming auction... wow, more beautiful things. We haven't seen this much carnival glass since we started collecting. And we're not even to the convention yet!

We did manage to stop a few more times (with the person in the back seat becoming more and more concerned about having a way home, wondering if maybe the clothes could be thrown out so there would be room for her), finding a few choice pieces here and there.

We finally made it: THE CONVENTION. First you empty the car, carrying all of your possessions to your room. And what a wonderful room! Then we decide we should set up our room display, and the work begins. "Did you notice everybody else has lights aimed at their display?" Good thing there is a Home Depot store right across the street. As we unpack our wonderful new purchases, people out wandering stop by to say hello and see what you have. One of the first couples through our door was also at their first convention. Rick & Debbie Graham stopped in to visit, and since they'd already discovered a few of the ins and outs, asked how much we wanted for the Peach Opal crimped Framed Flower. SELL IT??? (Were they nuts? We just bought it!) "Well, we don't really want to sell it... at least not yet."

"Oh, people sell glass out of their rooms? Neat."

After chatting for a few minutes, they moved on. And we immediately shut the door, and packed up all of our great, new stuff.

Finally, we have time to look around. The sight is too much to describe - every room has a large window facing the courtyard, and the windows are filled with carnival glass of every color, shape and pattern. You keep noticing displays with items you have only seen in pictures or have read about. Everyone is friendly and very welcoming. The doors to most rooms are open, and you can walk in, and see (but not touch) display glass; or pick up the pieces on the dressers (and beds!) to admire or buy. (There appear to be some very good buys made out of the rooms!) We didn't drool on anything that I know of, but it would have been understandable since our mouths were probably open!

Talk about a lot of choices: there are seminars, and a silent auction, and a midnight auction, and the pie social, and the convention auction, and the banquet! You learn SO much and meet way too many people to remember all of the names! We bought some beautiful glass (and started the s-l-o-w process of learning that more isn't necessarily better: one very good piece is better than 12 average pieces), said our good-byes at the Sunday morning breakfast, tried to get in a few Thank

You's for a great time, and started back home. This story can not convey how exciting and wonderful carnival glass conventions are. And if we can make one suggestion, it is for everyone who loves this terrific hobby and this exceptional glass to make a great effort to attend at least one convention. A STUDENT'S REPORT

Brandy Harman is a 6th grade student in the Walnut Grove School in Walnut Grove, Missouri. Brandy phoned me for an interview on collecting Carnival Glass. She had a lot of questions about how I started collecting and all about the carnival glass. Here is her school report...

"On February 16th, 1999, I interviewed Floyd Wright of Iowa. He has been a long time collector of carnival glass for 14 years. I asked him who started him on collecting carnival glass and he said Brent Looney showed him the first piece of carnival he'd ever seen. He said right then that he would like to start collecting carnival glass at the age of 58, because it was so beautiful and interesting. Then Floyd started on his way. He bought his first piece in Sweet Springs, MO. Later on throughout his collecting he'd been to many auctions throughout these states-Texas, Kansas, Nebraska, Iowa, Minnesota, Missouri, Wisconsin, Illinois, Tennessee, Indiana, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Kentucky and North Carolina. But in Willard, MO. at a farm auction he came across a very rare Rose Show plate that was worth a lot of money but he got it very reasonably priced. And that is his favorite piece. But auctions such as the farm auctions aren't the only place Floyd gets his carnival glass. He also gets it from antique shops, flea markets, and conventions. Once Floyd got into collecting carnival glass, the more he started studying the carnival glass a little more carefully, and he started reading books on carnival glass and what it was worth. He studied just like we study in school. He didn't just study the values but he also studied the history. He also told me how carnival glass got started. It was first started in 1907. It was made by Fenton in Williamstown, West Virginia. It was supposed to be a competitor to Tiffany glass which was made in New York. Tiffany glass was higher than carnival glass but it was not as well made as carnival glass. Carnival glass went through stages. These stages were: First, you poured glass into a mold and heated it. Second, you sprayed it with a chemical salt solution (that's how the glass got its color.) Then, the glass was taken on a pipe to what they called the Glory Hole in which the glass was reheated. Later on down the road carnival glass lost its popularity around the years 1920-1935. So the people that made carnival glass started sending the glass on trains to sell at street carnivals. And if your wondering how carnival glass got its name that's how. In the 1920's, when carnival glass started to not be popular anymore, red carnival glass came around. But other companies such as Dugan glass Co., Imperial Co., Millersburg Co., Northwood Co., Dugan Diamond Co., Cambridge Co., and many other small companies. These and other companies went through pretty much the same routine. They used 1500 different patterns and

54 different colors. Just to name a few colors here are some: Amber, Amethyst, Red, Blue, Green, Emerald Green, Horehound, Ice Blue, Ice Green, Purple, Marigold, Peach, Opalescent, Smoky, Vaseline, and White. Out of all of those Floyd said his favorite is opalescent. He also said at one time he had a lot of white carnival glass. Now carnival glass is worth \$20.00 - \$40,000. Except for the peoples vase made by Millersburg on June 14th, 1996 in North Carolina was sold for \$43,000. And that is the highest amount of money for carnival glass by auction. Now, Floyd is still collecting carnival glass. He had 400 pieces at one time but he had an auction in 1996 in Booneville and he sold 300 pieces. For now he has 200 in all. He said the only carnival glass he collects now is from the 1910's. Floyd is very happy he started collecting because he has a lot of fun collecting and going to auctions and conventions where he meets other collectors and becomes friends with them. He said it is like a big family and he's glad he's a part of it."

THE TRAVELLING TOOTHPICK HOLDER

In 1969, when Jim's new Air Force assignment was Anchorage, Alaska, we drove across country in a VW bug with ten days to make it from New Hampshire to Seattle, Washington. The car would have to be shipped to Alaska while we flew, courtesy of Uncle Sam. By the time we reached Montana, it was apparent that we would arrive with days to spare, so we decided to slow down a bit and take a few side trips... whenever we saw a sign that said "Antiques"!

The first sign we came to said "Wagon Wheel Antiques" in Bozeman, Montana. It was mid-afternoon when we stopped in the shop just off the highway. A very nice, middle-aged lady gave us not only a tour of her shop, but welcomed us into her home as well. One thing I remember vividly was the Pearl Grape and Cable centerpiece bowl, with gold trim, that I would love to have bought, but it was well beyond our means, even then. Besides, it wouldn't fit in our carry-on luggage. In the house, however, was a magnificent Purple Flute toothpick holder. That, I said to myself, would fit in our luggage and I could pack it without fear of further damage. I say "further" because it had a small, circular flake off the inside surface right at the "v" between two flutes. I knew a perfect one was selling for about \$70.00 at the time, and I'd never spend that kind of money. I asked if this one was for sale. She said, "Well... yes... if you want it "as is" for \$15.00".

Boy! Was I happy! It made the whole trip worthwhile!

That toothpick holder went with us to Alaska, returned with us to Virginia, and retired with us to New Hampshire in 1974.

But that's not the end of the story...

A couple years later, I turned our hobby into a business, using our collection as the beginning inventory. A local collector of all types of glass became not only a good friend but a fairly regular customer. And like me, she didn't care if something was not quite perfect as long as the price was fair for the condition. She wanted the toothpick holder. By this time I figured I **could** afford a perfect one, if one should surface, so I let her talk me out of my little traveller. She gave it a good home for 23 years.

Sadly, in December of 1998, she passed away and I lost a long-time friend. Within two days, her family contacted me and wanted to know if I knew someone

they could call to dispose of all her collectibles, or if I could do it for them. Was there anything in her collection that I wanted?

I was stunned and much too close to the situation to do more than refer them to a dealer that I knew who would be fair with an offer. They called him; he bought the bulk of her estate and everyone was happy.

About two months later, I was in a local group shop and Jim spotted a Purple Flute toothpick holder for \$10.00 "as is". He said, "Do you want it?" I didn't even think twice about it, even though I have another on my shelf. (Can't buy a St. Clair toothpick for that!)

It was not until we got home and unwrapped it that I noticed **why** it was "as is". It had a small, circular flake on the inside at the "v" between the flutes. I had just bought back the little traveller... for \$5.00 less than it cost 29 years ago! And, best of all, I have a most unexpected memento of my friend as well.
