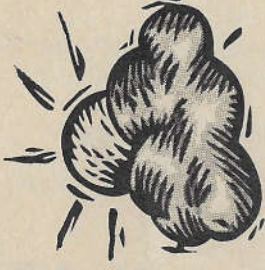

Charles and I have been members of Heart of America for a long time and were able to attend a few conventions, but last year's was unable to attend. I am sending check to renew my membership.

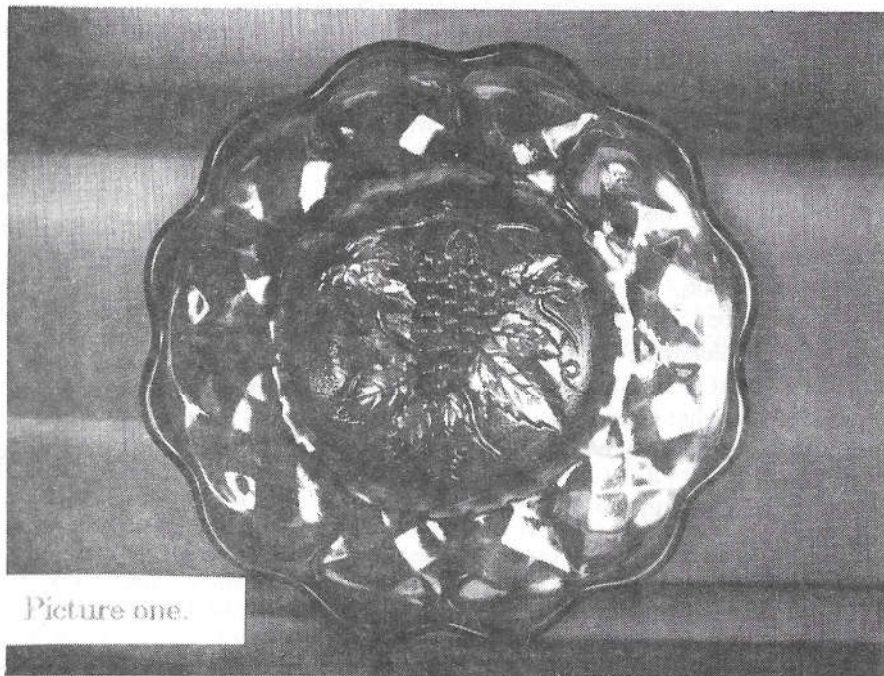

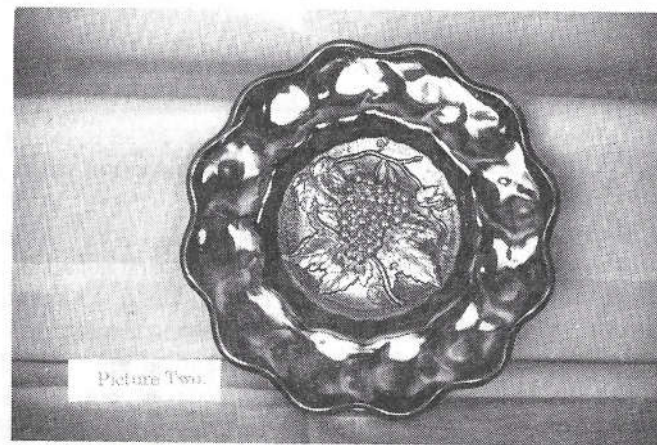
IMPERIAL'S SMALL HEAVY GRAPE PLATES

For whatever reason, the Imperial Glass company redesigned these 8" plate moulds. There are two distinct pattern designs featuring a subtle difference that becomes quickly apparent once it's pointed out. And like the age old question of which came first, "the chicken or the egg", we will not even attempt to say which came first or second, but only point out that there are two decidedly different plate moulds.

The first picture shows a pastel marigold plate with a distinct quilted diamond effect on the top outer face. And without getting into grape counting, it is obvious that the bunch of grapes is smaller. There are other less obvious variances that can be seen while holding the actual plates that are not easily seen in the pictures. Plates like "picture one" were made with a plain bottom plate mould, that is, it hasn't the star impressed on the bottom in the marie area as the other plate has. But both plates do have similar back patterns with 12 panel-like depressions. These plates can range from 8 inches to 9 inches in diameter and have been seen in smoke as wells as this pastel marigold.



The second picture (a dark marigold plate) lacks the quilted diamonds and has a larger bunch of grapes. We only have a few of these plates in other colors, so it is impossible for us to reach any determination as to the scarcity or availability of the two plate variations in the various colors. We do see most plates without the quilting, as in picture two. Can both types be found in all the different colors? Most plates we see at the antique malls are marigold, both types, and an occasional purple plate.

Carl Burns' "Imperial Carnival Glass" book shows a picture of what he calls a "Heavy Grape Variant" plate. His description is as follows: "The edge of the plate is not scalloped, but is completely smooth, with a distinctly 12-sided effect to it." The underlines are ours. A somewhat ambiguous statement? He states that only two of these plates are known. Are these whimsies?

The plate appears to be the same as our second picture, only with the twelve edge lobes somewhat smoothed or reduced. Something that would not require much effort for the "finisher" to do with his applewood paddle. So the bottom line is just like many other patterns, there are at least two variations to this popular plate.

Colors listed in David Doty's "A Field Guide to Carnival Glass" are amber, green, helios green, lime, marigold, purple, smoke and teal. Carl Burns' book additionally lists vaseline and emerald. Life was much simpler when green wasn't listed in four shades. And yes, many green Imperial glass pieces fluoresce using a "black light". But that in our opinion should not affect the price unless the seller is willing to give you the black light with the plate. And of course, rare color variations do exist such as the Marigold over Lime Green plate (lot. 141 at \$410), that sold in the recent Bob Gallo auction.

Carl Burns' book lists other shapes and colors in the Imperial Heavy Grape pattern. This is a "must have" book for any serious Imperial Glass collector. It Contains lots of good information and color pictures. See you at the antique mall?

ADVICE FOR THE NEW COLLECTOR

I have been collecting for 2 years now. In the two years I have learned a lot. I have bought every book I could find. I have attended 19 major carnival glass auctions and have attended 3 conventions. I still have a lot to learn but one thing I want to pass on to a new collector is to buy with caution when you are first starting.

Malls, shows and flea markets often have inflated prices on very common pieces. Often they use price guides to mark their glass and not all price guides are accurate as to what the glass really sells for. Price guides don't intentionally try to mislead anyone but often they do when you are a new collector.

When we first started collecting, we went out and bought everything we could find. Now we don't really like those first 100 pieces we purchased. They have poor color and were very over priced. So we learned an expensive lesson.

Every carnival collector advises you to buy good color and iridescence. When you're new, you're not too sure what that always is. So the more glass you see the more you will learn about color and iridescence. Auctions are a very good way to sharpen your skills about color, iridescence, patterns and prices.

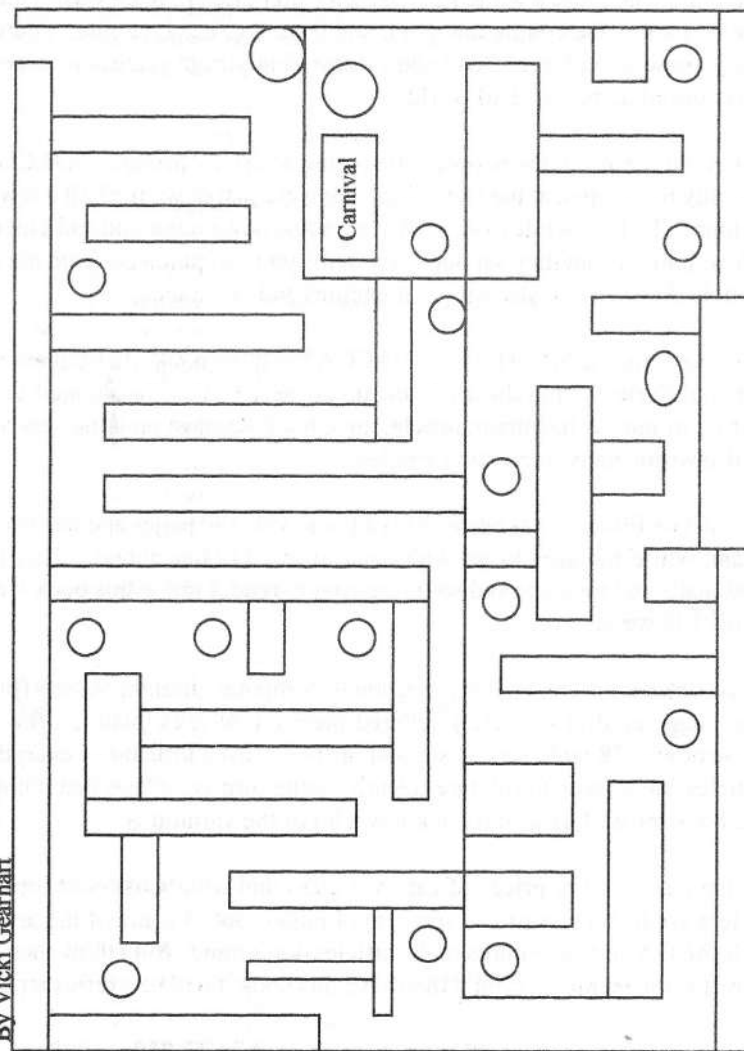
Prices are another subject. One example I would like to point out is a bowl we purchased as new collectors. It was a marigold Dugan Cherries footed bowl (quite common). We referred to the price guide we were using at that time it was the Standard Encyclopedia of Carnival Glass by Edwards, 5th edition. It valued the piece at \$210. The lady wanted \$185. So we felt we got a real good deal on that bowl.

As new collectors, we didn't realize that a price guide is only that, nothing more. Many guides give very different values. To continue on with this example, I would like to show you values from different sources on the marigold Dugan Cherries footed bowl.

1. Standard Encyclopedia of Carnival Glass 6th Edition (newest version) by Edwards & Carwile value the piece at \$240.
2. Sanctified Cross-Eyed Bears Price Trend Guide for Carnival Glass by Grizzle & Gilliland have average prices listed for each year:
1992 - average \$40 1993 - average \$35 1994 - average \$50
1995 - average \$60 1996 - average \$51 1997 - average \$53
3. A Field Guide to Carnival Glass by David Doty value the piece at \$50-\$70
4. I attended a Seeck auction on May 22nd. Jim sold three of these bowls. 2 were normal in color and sold for \$40 each. One was light in color and sold for only \$15.

So as you can see by just one example there are different ways to learn about prices. My advise is to go to the auctions, join the clubs and buy as many books as you can.

HOACGA Educational Series III is a book with 180 pages and has very clear black and white pictures to go with each article (174 pictures). This is very professionally put together and so interesting to read. I know this book was well worth the \$20 we paid for it.

This book has articles on bon bons, bowls, compotes, drinking vessels (pitchers, glasses, mugs, cordial sets, etc.), lettered pieces, novelties, plates, a few punch sets, rose bowls, 28 table sets, vases and rarities. Just a little bit of everything. The articles that go with the pictures identify some surprising facts that if it weren't for this book most of us would not know a lot of the variations.

I am also interested in prices of carnival glass and what glass sold for and the year. Here are just a few prices and years I pulled out of some of the articles. I hope HOACGA and the authors of the articles don't mind. But I think they will be of interest to the members even if they have this book it will be a refresher of sorts.

Olympic, small compote (amethyst or green?) sold for \$2,850. - 1990
Peacock Tail, ICS 6" bowl, red \$3,250. - 1995
Roses & Fruit, bon bon, blue \$2,600. - 1991
Poppy Show, plate, ice green sold for \$275. - 1975
Christmas compote, purple sold for \$2,900. - 1975

Peacock at the Fountain, fruit bowl, aqua opal sold for \$2,700. - 1975
Hanging Cherries, milk pitcher, marigold sold for \$1,175. - 1989

Dugan's Elk nappy prices realized were as follows:
(\$2,425. - 1973), (\$3,000. - 1988), (\$6,700 - 1993) and (\$7,000. - 1995)

There is a very interesting article on Rose Show bowls. Back in the 70's pastels were not very desirable and prices were low. An Aqua Opal Rose Show bowl sold for \$135. A marigold on Custard first reported being sold for \$250 in 1976. The same bowl sold at auction for \$14,000 in 1995. Don't you wish Grandma had a few of these in her cupboard? This entire article on Rose Show bowls was excellent about general information as well as the Rose Show bowls.

ON THE AUCTION TRAIL WITH CHUCK

May 27-29, 1999: Keystone Convention at Monroeville, Pennsylvania. I rode over with Harold Cox and we both agreed we had an enjoyable time. Harold showed us his very nice chop plate collection and talked about each plate at the banquet. It is a shame more people couldn't find the time to stay for the banquet and enjoy Harold's talk and the white elephant sale that followed.

When my wife Marge and I first started collecting carnival glass, a trip to a convention was the highpoint of the year. It was a time to meet and visit with a lot of people, see some glass we had never seen before and just maybe there would be a decent auction, but the auction was secondary. That was the era of friendship and knowledge gathering. All this has changed over the years. In my opinion a convention now is little more than an auction with a day or two of looking and visiting tacked on that some of us "hard core" collectors still participate in. There are many more conventions now and it seems to me if some are to survive it is high time for a change in format.

I attend several conventions each year, and more often than not I see a mass exodus after the auction; and when banquet time comes there are few people to enjoy what used to be the grand finale of the "party" Is the auction the "tail that wags the Dog?" If so, maybe it is time to party first and buy last! I believe some of the local or regional conventions need to change or else.

There are some conventions that recognize the friendship part and do a nice job of creating a good atmosphere. It is hard to have a good party when people are scattered all over a large hotel. Control of room assignment by the club is a must in my opinion. Air Capital, HOACGA and Keystone in its Brookville years when Denny Keck was handling it are examples of returning to the same location and having a local person in charge—it makes a big difference.

This year's Keystone Convention is a prime example of the picture I am trying to paint. Remember "Ol' Lonesome Joe"—that is how some people must feel when they are the only person on a wing of a floor and nobody ever shows up to look at their glass or just visit. To their credit the Keystone people recognized the problem and are determined to do something about it—they will survive.

Yes, there was an auction at Monroeville. Bums Auction Service did a super job—so good in fact the auction was over at 12 noon on Saturday. The top end pieces sold well. I liked the \$2000 9 1/2 inch blue Leaf Chain plate, the \$5600 marigold Christmas compote and the \$1400 7 1/2 inch rootbeer/amber Pine Cone plate. I took the Phoenix marigold/milk glass Lacy Dewdrop sugar and creamer home to add to my collection. I thought there were a few too many bowls and the like in the auction, and as a result there were some good buys.

June 10-12, 1999: Lincoln-Land Convention. Hotter than blazes with thunderstorms each evening, raining when we loaded out on Sunday morning and a hotel that sure could use some TLC. Sounds bad, but there were some offsetting pluses. It was the typical L-L convention with the Early Arrivers Pizza Party on Thursday evening and the traditional early Friday evening hospitality room spread with smoked salmon and a lot of accompaniments.

Bums Auction Service had a two part auction that sold glass from the Charlotte Williams collection. Except for a brief period late Friday evening, the sale moved right along and in my opinion was a very successful sale. I thought prices on the high end were good, but a piece or two didn't live up to pre-sale guesses. In recent years we have all heard "Mugs are down." Well, we saw some nice mugs sell like the \$1200 AO, \$1500 sapphire, \$650 white, \$350 horehound, \$375 electric blue and \$450 green Singing Birds. Some other prices included the \$5500 AO ruffled Good Luck bowl, \$10,000 AO Peacock at the Fountain fruit bowl, \$3700 ice green opal ruffled Peacocks bowl, \$1500 dark marigold 7 piece Acorn Burr water set, \$2250 smoke Imperial Poppy Show vase and the very rare 5 piece Dahlia with blue stain on flowers water set that stopped at \$3250.

The star of the sale was the marigold whimsey two handled vase made from the Orange Tree Orchard water pitcher mold that found a new home at \$7000. All in all this was a good 270 piece auction.

The L-L convention banquet is one that still "sells out." We moved to the "big" room this year and the space was needed. The highlight was the two storytellers, Bill Richards and George Loescher, showing some of their fabulous glass and spinning the tales about each piece—a fitting end to a good convention.

June 19, 1999: It was off to Missouri to the Mickey Reichel auction and a visit after the auction with my wife Marge's sisters at Brookfield, just a few miles up the road. It is about 400 miles each way, so it sometimes takes a couple of reasons for me to go to this auction.

Some good glass in the main auction with more than 20 percent going to mail bidders. I didn't stay for the John Britt miniatures so I do not know how they sold. There was a good crowd and the very top pieces sold very well. I thought the 30 Australian items did real well, with half of them going to mail bidders. When the sale got past the top end and Australian pieces, the prices seemed to drop off considerably in my opinion.

I saw some of the glass Mickey has lined up for the Air Capital convention auction in October. This auction promises to be a good one. I have my reservation made!

WILD ROSE WHIMSEY PLATE BY NORTHWOOD

I became infatuated with this pattern when Carol and I purchase a Wild Rose whimsey plate at the Pacific Northwest Convention Auction in Eugene, Oregon. Over the years, we have accumulated five pieces of this pattern, including 1 nut bowl in fiery amethyst, 1 nut bowl in a rich purple, 1 nut bowl in marigold, 1 rose bowl in green, and lastly, the whimsey plate.

Not until recently have we had an opportunity to put all five pieces together for a true comparison study. The results were quite surprising. The three nut bowls have 26 alternating smooth and stippled rays in the interior. The two green pieces have 51 smooth rays in the interior. The nut bowls have the iridescent treatment on both the interior and exterior surfaces while the two green pieces are iridized on the smooth rays (interior), only. The "flames" on the nut bowls have a rich satiny iridescence versus a more lackluster silvery treatment on the green pieces. The nut bowls 3 knurled feet have a smooth flowing confluence into a round 2 1/2" collar, and the feet have about 3 1/2" separation, while the green pieces have the knurled feet that seem to have been "snipped" off on the interior and merged bluntly into a 1 1/2" Marie type collar and these feet have an approximate 4" separation. The shell-like motifs on the nut bowls have 10 separate folds while the green piece shell motif has 12.

According to Carl Burns in his research on Northwood, these pieces are known in Marigold, Amethyst, Green, Cobalt Blue, and Ice Blue. In his book there is a picture of a green bowl with a plain unpatterned interior. He also lists this bowl as being available in a collar-based shape. The example shown in HOACGA's Carnival Glass Patterns is also a green unpatterned example in a rose bowl shape. They also list one known example in Celeste Blue with an attribution suspected to be by Dugan.

Conclusions: I suspect that there were at least two different moulds used for this pattern, and perhaps Dugan might also have manufactured these pieces using the Northwood Mark. All of our examples have the encircled and underlined "N". The appearance of the "Marie" on the green examples is definite evidence of a different procedure used in their manufacture. In my personal observations, I have never seen a green example with the alternating stippled and smooth rays, not have I seen a green example with iridization applied to the exterior surfact. The above pictured whimsey plate would surely have to be considered very rare. I have never seen another example, but who knows, there certainly may be more out there.

CALIFORNIA AKA BEADED GRAPE

Ok... Here we go again. I have said on several occasions that I don't like to do this... but... due to my limited resources for research, I don't have much of a choice with this piece. We bought this piece on the way to HOACGA this year. (how many of you passed this piece up?) There was something about it that just "tugged" at my heart strings and said "buy me... take me home with you". And so I did.

Of course at the HOACGA Convention I tried to find anyone who might know something about it. At the top of the list was Frank Fenton. He looked the piece over and shook his head and said he knew nothing about the piece. We showed it to others, Jim Seeck, Richard Cinclair, Mickey Reichel, Dave Doty, and many others who happened into our room. Finally, at the request of Frank Fenton, a couple came in who saw the piece and confidently announced they had seen it before and would return the next day and tell us about it.

Sure enough, they did. I don't recall the names of the very nice couple, but they were really into Westmoreland Glass. They returned to our room the following day and stated that this was a US Glass Company product and was know as "California" or "Beaded Grape".

When we returned home, we looked it up in our "Pattern Glass" book by Mollie Helen McCain, and there it was. (We think.) It was referred to as "California" or "Beaded Grape" attributed to the US Glass Company as pattern #15059 (Bryce: Ripley), circa 1899. They stated it was a "state series" and was produced in extended table service including cake stand, cordial, compote, round and "square" pitchers, toopick holders, 6" vase, wine, bowls, tray, pickle dish, sauces, salt shaker, tumblers, berry set, and bread tray with "good" availability. It was know to have come in crystal, and emerald green, but... you guessed it, NOT in amethyst, and certainly NOT in Carnival Glass.

Ok, so here we go again. Why do we suddenly have appear a stemmed square compote? No pictures accompanied the description except a drawing of a pitcher, and... in carnival glass? Why does this happen to me? There was something that "reached out" and "grabbed" me the moment that I laid eyes on it.

Now this is certainly not an earth-shattering discovery by any means. However, I would consider it a "noteworthy" discovery. Had it had a "high dollar" price tag on it, I might have passed it up. As it was, I purchased it (with a look of chagrin from my lovely wife)! But it was priced low enough that I bought it. And glad I am that I did! It is a beautiful amethyst color with quite striking iridescence and a odd compote shape with a square stemmed base and a square bowl. It stands 4" tall with a square 5" bowl and a square 2 7/8" stemmed base. There are 9 beads in each of the 4 corners of the bowl, with prism-like serrations bordering the square base. The bowl's four sides each have a "grape branch" with 5 grape leaves and 2 bunches of grapes and 3 grape tendrils. It is iridized on both interior and exterior surfaces with the interior of the bowl being smooth and plain. There are no marks on this piece.

Again, here is an unusual item that certainly must be scarce or rare in Carnival Glass, and most certainly adds tremendously to the wonderful hobby that we all hold in common. This is yet another example of a previously unlisted or reported item in Carnival Glass. Trust me, there are many more out there!!!
