

"Bishop's Mitre" Vase

Bob Bishop of Dracut, MA has come up with another unusual and rare piece of carnival. He did not know what it was until his friend Bob Smith of Boston was telling the Thistlewoods about the vase. Since any carnival glass piece must have a name, the Thistlewoods named it "Bishops Mitre".


The vase is blue and stands 8" tall, has a 3 1/2" top opening, and a 2 1/2" bottom diameter with RIIHMIAKI molded on the base in block letters, with two dots over the A. This is the only known vase with the molded Riihmiaki trademark. There is an arch on opposite sides of the vase with star at the top of the arch with steps leading to the star. The other two sides of the vase is pyramid shaped that is stippled. Within

the pyramid there 4 blades of grass with three air bubbles above them.

Bob sent a photograph of the vase and it is included in the fifth section of the HOACGA notebook, vase # 299. It is also shown in Network # 15, which is a publication by Glen and Steven Thistlewood.

Unusual Shapes

Here are two very similar shaped small vases made by the Imperial Glass Company that we believe qualify for the unusual shape category. They were certainly not true whimsies as they were apparently made in considerable number. The File pattern comes close to being a whimsy as some writers believe that it was shaped from a spooner or covered sugar. But many patterns are first pressed in a basic

shape and then hand formed into a large variety of shapes. File was made in many different shapes and colors, used as both a primary and secondary pattern. However, this corseted vase is found only in a nice dark marigold. It is considered relatively scarce but we still don't consider it a whimsy. There is a term *production whimsy* bantered about that might apply here, but that is as far as we could go. The current price range for these in the past two years is between \$250 and \$550.

The Rococo vase, on the other hand, is much easier to find and comes in several colors. Marigold and smoke are the two common colors with a rare lavender reported now and then. This vase shape in our opinion was made from the small ruffled candy dish that can be found occasionally. The glass worker that came up with this corseted shape was creative, to say the least. Prices today for a marigold example run from a low of \$70 to a high of \$180. The smoke vase has a range of \$175 to \$390.

Carol Cinclair's Top Ten Reasons for Collecting Carnival Glass

- 10. It's a lot better than collecting Beanie Babies.
- 9. It's a great way to decorate our home. This implies that there is some decorating going on and the glass isn't stuck in a box under one's bed or stacked one on top of the other on a table.
- 8. It's a conversation generator when friends and relatives visit.
- 7. It's a source of travel conventions and auctions.
- 6. It's a good investment.

We get to spend our money and keep it too. If an emergency comes along and we ever need the money, we can sell the glass and retrieve our original investment.

5. It has aesthetic value.

It really is a piece of art that is beautiful to look at. We are just caretakers

of museum quality glass. Eventually, someone else will own all of it. So we need to carefully care for it.

Of course, the ones with electric iridescence are always topped out in price. Rarities are not always in demand as much as items with high desirability. The items that are pleasing to the eye are the ones that seem to really hold on to the high prices.

I once saw a phrase written "Rare, who cares item" and that is sometimes the case. You may have an item that is rare, but if people don't find it attractive it won't do too well in value. Of course, all I have written is just my opinion. We are all entitled to them right?

The glass in the rooms at the HOACGA convention was nice too. A lot of glass for sale, both old carnival and some rooms had contemporary carnival since their convention is held just days before HOACGA some stay to sell to the HOACGA collectors.

Most of the carnival glass started out as unknown but with the continuing research it will be identified. 


Plate Display - HOACGA Convention

Heart of America Carnival Glass Association Annual Meeting – April 28, 2000

Embassy Suites Hotel - Kansas City, Missouri

President Bob Grissom called the meeting to order and announced that one of the requirements of the bylaws is that an annual meeting be held on the fourth Friday in April each year.

Minutes of the April 23, 1999 meeting were read and approved.

Treasurer Cliff Ball reported on the income and expenses of the HOACGA fiscal year from March 1, 1999 through February 28, 2000. He displayed pie charts on income and expenses which showed that 29% of income is from membership dues; 27% from sale of educational materials, tapes and souvenirs; 26% from convention income and remainder from miscellaneous sources. Cliff noted that former treasurer Doug Peters had completed payment of his reimbursement to the club - which accounted for the income from miscellaneous sources.

On expenses - 48% on newsletter; 14% on mailing educational materials, videos and souvenirs; 44% on convention. Cliff noted that many members donate their time and travel to prepare for the convention, send the newsletter and many other projects.

Cliff noted some of the anticipated expenses for the coming year would be an increase in postage cost for the newsletter and the 2000 roster has been published. Speaker fee has been increased from \$250 to \$300. The audit service reported all records in order. Treasurer's report was approved.

Election for Treasurer, Vice President and Bulletin Secretary were held. Names in nomination were Gene Cox as Vice President, Cliff Ball as Treasurer and Tom Limback as Bulletin Secretary. Additional nominations were sought from the floor. None were forthcoming and all those in nomination were elected to serve two year terms.

President asked for input on program for next year's convention, announced forthcoming conventions of other clubs and urged members to write articles for the bulletin.

- A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.


It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.


