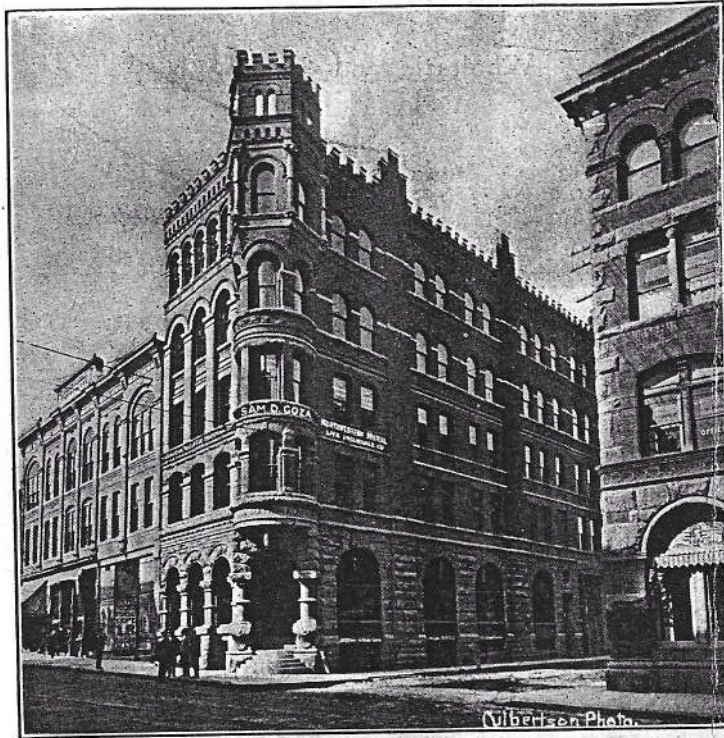

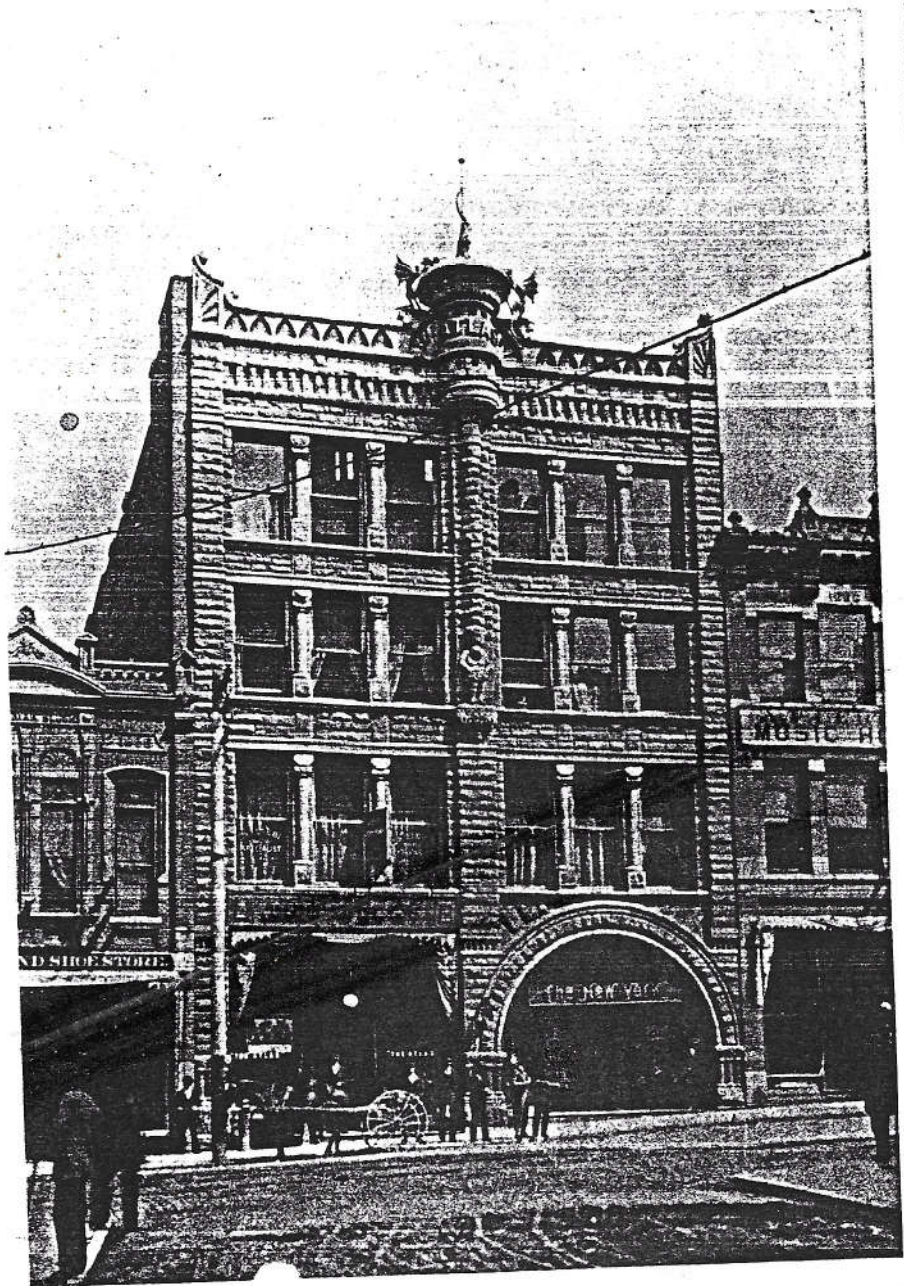

Early candy store satisfied local sweet tooth

Just before Valentine's Day, many thoughtful husbands and hopeful suitors will walk to the Parrot Confectionery Store on Last Chance Gulch to buy a treat for their sweethearts. It's been that way for years.

But the same thing was happening 90 years ago in Helena at a slightly different location. Then, candy buyers headed a couple blocks south of the Parrot to Brazier's Candies in the Atlas Block at 9 N. Main St. (The name was changed to Last Chance Gulch in the 1950s).

Advertised as "The Choice of Cultured Taste," Brazier's carried a full line of candy, ice creams, ices, frozen pudding, punches and fancy cakes. But it was the candy that made Brazier's a household word. Piled high on trays and in bowls were not only delectable hand-rolled chocolates but also marshmallows, nougat, caramels, jelly and gum goods and the always-favorite penny candy.

Proprietors included John J. Brazier, president of the firm, and his brothers Frank W. Brazier, vice president, and Albert R. Brazier, secretary-treasurer. They also ran a wholesale outlet for their goods at 115 W. Lawrence. Before locating in Helena around the turn of the century, the brothers had crossed the plains pushing a Mormon cart to

Salt Lake City, according to Marie Brazier. Her late husband Geoffrey, an attorney, was related to the candy company owners although his father, Charles, was in the mining business. Over the years, Marie and Geoffrey collected a few pieces of candy company memorabilia.

Soon after Brazier's opened around 1905, it became a popular destination on Main Street, a busy corridor of soaring brick-and-stone business buildings, banks and hotels. In the early years, trolley cars brought ladies in their long skirts to shop at Gans and Klein, a leading clothing store on the corner of Main and Broadway next door to Brazier's. The trolley tracks ran up the center of brick-paved streets, a welcome improvement over Helena's original dirt streets.

After shopping along the gulch, the confectionery was a favorite stop for a soda on a warm day or a cup of cocoa on a cold one. And, of course, a small sack of peanut brittle or a box of maple creams could be tucked into a shopping bag or purse before returning home.

In time, Brazier's Candies was selling statewide and then to adjacent states. Their attractive packaging included gold- or silver-colored one- or two-pound cardboard boxes of Salome chocolates. The cover featured a bas-relief of an alluring woman leaning provocatively against a marble column while birds plucked at her gossamer gown.

For really special occasions, the Braziers were happy to fill a 25-pound box with chocolates. The lid of that four-inch-deep candy box featured a colored print of a sweet red-haired young girl peering into a looking glass while holding a small bouquet of violets to her breast. Store giveaways included bookmarks and colored postcards of the business.

In April, the Braziers usually started planning for their busy Christmas market by ordering specialty items to promote their products. Some of the more popular choices were the amethyst glass candy dishes made by the Fenton Glass Co. of Martins Ferry, Ohio. The Fenton Co. started in 1905, about the same year as Brazier's, and by 1907, was making "Iridescent" glass, now known as "Carnival" glass, as advertising media. Soon the Brazier brothers were offering three styles of the inexpensive and popular dishes. A shopper could choose a six-inch plate, a small bowl or a "hand grip" plate with a turned-up edge that could also be used as a calling card tray. The dishes featured two molded marigold-style flowers with Brazier's Candies spelled out in the center. Of course they were filled with candy. (Today the Fenton Art Glass Company is the largest manufacturer of handmade colored glass in the United States.)

Marie Brazier has several Brazier's Candies dishes but is always hoping to add to her small collection. "I know there must be some still sitting in china cupboards in Helena," she said.

By 1910, the candy company added bread and pastry to its shelves, and in 1913, the company supplied Yellowstone Park with 9,000 wooden boxes filled with candy. On the box top a wood-burning tool marked out "Brazier's Helena Mont. Souvenir Chocolates" and outlined two hand-colored photographs of the park. That same year, their candy won first prize at the Montana State Fair in Helena.

Soon after the retail outlet moved north of the Atlas Block to 133 N. Main St., A.R. Brazier, still secretary of the company, decided Great Falls would be a better location for the business than Helena. He believed the Electric City offered superior manufacturing and shipping advantages, and he set out to convince a reluctant board of directors it was time to make a move. They apparently acquiesced after lengthy correspondence and discussions with members of the Great Falls Commercial Club and other interested investors.

On April 4, 1914, the Great Falls Tribune proclaimed, "Brazier's Candies Will Be Made Here." The ensuing article pointed out, "The finances required by the company have practically all been assured." It continued, "It may be said, in no sense of facetiousness, to be the sweetest fact that has been published here in many months, for it means a large payroll. They plan to develop their factory force to 100 or more employees within a short period after opening here and it will mean the bringing of a large number of families to the city to meet the added demand in labor."

A campaign to raise \$2,500 in public subscription funds to cover the cost of dismantling and moving the candy-making equipment to Great Falls was apparently successful. Also, a number of prominent Great Falls businessmen, including Paris Gibson, agreed to buy \$2,400 worth of preferred shares of Brazier stock at eight percent to help pay for construction of a new factory.

On July 26, 1914, the Tribune published an engraving of the new factory and a lengthy article on the pending move. It reported a new 8,000-square-foot manufacturing plant was under construction. The two-story stone-and-brick factory located on the industrial trackage at Tenth Avenue South and Fifth Street was estimated to cost \$20,000. The Tribune predicted that not only would the city profit from "...direct benefits from its payrolls, but the farmer in the vicinity also profits as there are large quantities of cream and eggs used in the manufacture of candies." The newspaper suggested the daily factory capacity would soon reach 5,000 pounds.

In the Tribune article, building contractor H.H. Roone estimated the building would be ready for occupancy by September 15, 1914. But by early September, something had gone terribly wrong. It was then the Braziers hired Wellington D. Rankin, a prominent Helena attorney, to sue the Great Falls Commercial Club "...for failing to perform agreed upon conditions." Ultimately, the company remained in Helena at its Main St. location.

In 1916, Albert moved to Salt Lake City where he continued to represent the candy company. But after World War I, when sugar shortages made commercial candy making difficult, the business closed and John J. Brazier

moved to Lewistown, according to Marie Brazier.

Although Brazier's Candies no longer tempts buyers with chocolate bonbons and colorful mints, the Parrot Confectionery does, thank sweet heaven.

Carnival Glass Newsletter Article

BRAZIER'S CANDIES By Frank M. Fenton

I am looking at pages A5 and A6 in John Resnik's fine book, THE ENCYCLOPEDIA OF CARNIVAL GLASS LETTERED PIECES. John says he has been unable to come up with any information about this company. I have some information.

I have a niece named Ann Ripley who lives in Helena, MT. She knows a lady there named Marie Brazier. I asked her to go see Marie to see if she could give us any information on Brazier's Candies. She came back with a wonderful newspaper article about Brazier's Candies and some post cards and some photographs. We now have in the Fenton Museum a Brazier's Candies Lettered Plate, loaned to the museum by Marie Brazier.

Here is condensed information from February 12, 2003 edition of the Queen City News in Helena, Mt. This is Volume 1, No. 38. The article is written by Kay Hardin-Hansen. Brazier's Candies was located in the Atlas Block at 9 North Main Street. Since that time, the name of the street has been changed to Last Chance Gulch. In 1905, Brazier's Candies was located with their retail outlet in Helena, MT.

Proprietors included John J. Brazier, President of the firm, and his brothers, Frank W. Brazier, Vice President and Albert R. Brazier, Secretary/Treasurer. They also ran a wholesale outlet for their goods at 115 West Lawrence. Before locating in Helena, around the turn of the century, the brothers had crossed the plains pushing a Mormon cart to Salt Lake City according to Marie Brazier. Her late husband, Jeffrey, an attorney was related to the candy company owners, although his father, Charles, was in the mining business. Over the years, Marie and Jeffrey collected a few pieces of candy company memorabilia.

The newspaper article says a sign advertising Brazier's candy indicates that the gold and silver Salome boxes were a popular item in 1910. We believe that's about the time Fenton made the Amethyst Carnival Glass Plate for this company. About 1913, the retail outlet moved north of the Atlas Block to 133 North Main Street. A. R. Brazier who was still Secretary of the company decided that Great Falls would be a better location for the business than Helena. On April 14, 1914, Great Falls Tribune proclaimed, "Brazier's candies will be made here". There is no proof or indication that the Brazier Company ever occupied the premises in Great Falls. After World War I with a sugar shortage, the business closed and John J. Brazier moved to Lewistown, according to Marie Brazier. A post card is reproduced showing the location on North Main Street.

P.S. Don Moore wrote an article for the American Collector. In it he describes carnival glass vendors and he illustrates the Brazier's Candy Plate and attributes it to Northwood. He also attributes the Age Herald Plate in Birmingham to Millersburg. We now know that both of these plates were made by Fenton. We live and learn.
